Condensed Financial Statements For the six months ended 30 June 2025

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A. Performance Summary and Outlook

Strong 1H 2025 Results Signal Resilience and Strategic Strength

The Group delivered steady results for 1H 2025, with revenue increasing 3.4% to S\$295.5 million and PATMI rising 29.2% to S\$28.0 million, reflecting operational resilience and financial discipline in a fluid macro environment.

An interim dividend of 2 cents per share, representing a 67% payout of 1H 2025 NPAT, has been declared for payment on 2 September 2025.

Business Segments

Flexible Staffing (FS)

Revenue increased by S\$10.5m (4.1%) to S\$265.8m, maintaining its share of Group revenue at 89.9% and contribution to gross profit (GP) at 52.0%.

Contractor volume grew by 3.7% to 16,140, led by activity in Taipei, Jakarta, and Shanghai. GP per contractor declined 6.3%, resulting in a 2.8% reduction in FS GP to S\$31.8m.

GP Margin eased to 12.0% (1H 2024: 12.8%), largely due to higher volume contributions from lower-margin international markets, and a dip in volumes from the relatively higher-margin Singapore FS business.

Professional Recruitment (PR)

Revenue declined by S\$0.9m (3.3%) to S\$27.7m. Contribution to Group revenue and GP stood at 9.4% and 45.1% respectively (1H 2024: 10.0% and 45.5%).

GP fell 3.5%, in line with a 0.5% decline in GP per placement and a 3.0% drop in placement volume. However, senior executive search volume increased by 6.1%, and average billing per placement rose 12.2%, lifting GP for this segment by 19.0% and partially offsetting weaker performance at the mid and junior levels.

PR GPM remained fairly constant at 99.7% (1H 2024: 99.9%).

Group-level GPM declined from 22.0% to 20.7%, reflecting FS's growing share in the business mix.

Geographical Performance

Singapore

Remains the Group's largest market, contributing 63.7% of total revenue (1H 2024: 66.7%). Revenue declined 1.2% and GP contracted by 8.2%, affected by a softer hiring climate in both FS and PR.

Taipei

Delivered revenue growth of 16.9% and GP growth of 14.0%, supported by continued demand in ecommerce, semiconductors, and technology-related roles.

Mainland China

Revenue rose 12.4% on the back of FS volume gains. However, PR business in Shanghai remained subdued, limiting total contribution.

Sectoral Trends

- **Semiconductors**: Surged 29% on continued global chip demand.
- **Digital and IT Roles**: Grew 18%, supported by ecommerce and AI-driven hiring.
- **Financial Services & Manufacturing**: Continued to register growth.
- Retail & Healthcare: Recorded marginal declines.
- **Public Sector**: Accounted for 14.6% of revenue (1H 2024: 14.2%), with contributions from Singapore, Hong Kong S.A.R., Taipei, and Shanghai.

Operating Expenses

Increased by S\$1.3m:

- Controllable SG&A costs declined by S\$0.2m, mainly from reduced facility and depreciation charges.
- Other expenses rose S\$1.6m, due mainly to an S\$1.0m unrealised foreign exchange loss on intercompany balances (1H 2024: S\$0.5m gain).

Other Income

Rose by S\$9.3m:

- S\$7.5m uplift in Singapore government grants under the Progressive Wage Credit Scheme.
- S\$2.9m in unrealised revaluation gains (vs. S\$1.8m unrealised loss in 1H 2024).

These were partially offset by:

- Non-recurrence of a S\$2.3m reversal of prior year accruals.
- S\$0.9m reduction in interest income due to lower prevailing rates.

Financial Position & Cash Flow

The Group maintained a healthy balance sheet with total cash and CLN/T-bills¹ of S\$311.7m (2024: S\$311.4m). Cash on hand was S\$232.6m, following a net cash outflow of S\$25.7m comprising:

- S\$27.3m from operating inflows;
- S\$26.7m from investing activities (mainly CLN/T-bills purchases);
- S\$26.2m from financing outflows, which included dividend payments, lease repayments, minority buyouts, and share buybacks.

Trade receivables rose S\$1.7m on higher revenue, while debtor turnover improved to 58 days (2024: 60 days).

Other assets include gold investments, which rose by \$\$1.9m, including a \$\$1.0m revaluation gain.

Other current financial assets increased S\$26.5m due to net additions to CLN/T-bills. Non-current financial assets benefitted from a S\$7.4m revaluation gain on strategic holdings in Staffline Group Plc and Bamboos Health Care Holdings Ltd.

Other non-current assets included a S\$2.9m property acquisition in Jakarta for internal use.

¹ Credit Linked Notes (CLN) are DBS issued notes with Monetary Authority of Singapore (MAS) bill as credit underlying. T-bills are short-term Singapore Government Securities (SGS) issued by MAS.

Outlook on Macro Risks

The outlook for 2H remains uncertain, with evolving trade dynamics potentially influencing client hiring plans:

- Singapore's base tariff rate remains low at 10%, but global trade linkages may pose indirect risks.
- Taiwan's effective tariff rate has eased to 20%, narrowing the gap with ASEAN.
- Mainland China continues to face 30% export and 10% US import tariffs, with transshipment routes under scrutiny.

Execution Priorities on Controllables

1. Recruitment Pyramid Focus

The Group will continue to strengthen its focus on the higher-value segment of the recruitment pyramid — particularly in strategic and senior-level roles — supported by infrastructure that enables cross-border talent mobilisation.

The FS segment remains a key revenue contributor, underpinned by recurring government contracts, operational efficiency, and systems strength.

2. **Deepening Co-Ownership Leadership**

10 new Business Leader Co-Owners were appointed in 1H 2025, bringing the total to 45. The Group continues to see co-ownership as a strategic lever that aligns operational accountability and business performance, supporting the pursuit of long-term growth amid changing conditions.

F. Notes to the condensed consolidated financial statements for the period ended 30 June 2025

1. General

HRnetGroup Limited (the "Company") (Registration No.201625854G) is incorporated in Singapore with its principal place of business and registered office at 391A Orchard Road, #23-03 Ngee Ann City Tower A, Singapore 238873. The Company is listed on the mainboard of the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited ("SGX-ST"). These condensed consolidated financial statements as at and for the six months ended 30 June comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the "Group").

The principal activity of the Company is that of investment holding.

The principal activities of the Group are providing services on:

- (a) Professional Recruitment; and
- (b) Flexible Staffing.

2. Basis of preparation

The condensed financial statements have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 *Interim Financial Reporting* and should be read in conjunction with the annual consolidated financial statements of the Group and statement of financial position and statement of changes in equity of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The same accounting policies, presentation and methods of computation have been followed in these condensed financial statements as were applied in the preparation of the Group's financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards which have no material effect on the condensed financial statements of the Group.

2.1. Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the condensed consolidated financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024.

3. Segment and revenue information

For purposes of resource allocation and assessment of segment performance, the Group's chief operating decision makers have focused on the business operating units which in turn are segregated based on the type of services supplied. This forms the basis of identifying the segments of the Group under SFRS(I) 8 Operating segments as follows:

- (a) Professional recruitment;
- (b) Flexible staffing; and
- (c) Others.

The accounting policies of the reportable segments are the same as the Group's accounting policies applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024. Segment profit represents the profit earned by each segment without allocation of other income, other employee benefit expenses, facilities and depreciation expenses, selling expenses, other expenses and finance costs. This is the measure reported to the chief operating decision makers for the purposes of resource allocation and assessment of segment performance.

Information regarding the operations of each reportable segment is included below.
