## **E. Notes to the condensed interim consolidated financial statement**

### **1. Corporate information**

CFM Holdings Limited (the “**Company**”) (Co. Reg. No. 200003708R) is a public limited company incorporated and domiciled in Singapore. The Company is listed on the Catalist Board of Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited (“**SGX-ST**”). These condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the six months ended 31 December 2025 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the “**Group**”).

The registered office and principal place of business of the Company is located at 4008 Ang Mo Kio Street Avenue 10, #04-22, Techplace 1, Singapore 569139.

The principal activity of the Company is that of an investment holding company. The principal activities of the Group are:

- (a) Manufacturing of metal plates and metal stamping;
- (b) Manufacturing and fabricating engineering tools; and
- (c) Trading and supplying disposable and wearable for use in cleanrooms, bio-medical, laboratories and hospitals.

The financial information contained in this announcement has neither been audited nor reviewed by the Company's auditors. The latest audited annual financial statements of the Group were not subject to an adverse opinion, qualified opinion or disclaimer of opinion.

The ultimate controlling persons of the Group are Ip Kwok Wing, the Executive Chairman and his spouse, Lim Fong Li Janet, the Chief Executive Officer.

### **2. Basis of preparation**

The condensed interim financial statements for the six months ended 31 December 2025 have been prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) (“**SFRS(I)**”) 1-34 *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group’s financial position and performance of the Group since the last annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2025.

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted for the unaudited condensed consolidated interim financial statements are consistent with those adopted by the Company in its most recently audited annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2025, which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1 below.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore dollar which is the Company’s functional currency.

#### **2.1 New and amended standards adopted by the Group**

A number of amendments to Standards have become applicable for the current reporting period.

The Group did not have to change its accounting policies or make retrospective adjustments as a result of adopting the new accounting standards.

#### **2.2 Use of estimates and judgments**

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgments estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported

amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgments made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2025.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The areas involving critical judgment in applying accounting policies, or areas where assumptions and estimation uncertainties have a significant risk of resulting in material adjustment within the next financial period are disclosed in the following notes:

- Write-down of inventories (Note 8)

## 4.2 Reportable segments

The Group is organised into four business segments, with each segment representing a strategic business segment that offers different products in the respective markets.

The Group has four reportable operating segments as follows:

- (i) Metal stamping - manufacturing of metal plates and metal stamping;
- (ii) Tooling - manufacturing and fabricating of engineering tools and dies;
- (iii) Components and parts - trading of other components and parts, warehousing and others and service logistics business; and
- (iv) Cleanroom products - trading of disposables and wearables for use in cleanroom, bio-medical, laboratories and hospitals.

The Group ceased operations in the components and parts business segment in 1H2025.

## 8. Write-down of inventories

Management reviews the inventory listing on a periodic basis. This review involves a comparison of the carrying amount of the aged inventory items with the respective net realisable value. The purpose is to estimate the net realisable value and to determine any write-down is to be made in the financial statements for slow-moving items. Management is satisfied that the inventories have been written down adequately in the financial statements.

The carrying amount of inventories of the Group after the write-down is approximately S\$3.30 million (FY2025: S\$3.60 million). During the financial period, the Group recognised inventories write-down of S\$36,000 (FY2025: S\$148,000), whilst inventories written off were Nil (FY2025: S\$9,000) and write-back was S\$71,000 (FY2025: S\$156,000).

### **Review of consolidated statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income**

#### **1H2026 vs. 1H2025**

##### **Revenue**

The Group recorded a revenue of approximately S\$10.48 million for 1H2026, which was a decrease of approximately S\$2.10 million or 16.69% (1H2025: approximately S\$12.58 million) when compared to 1H2025. The decrease was mainly due to reduced customer orders in the metal stamping and tooling segments, driven by softer demand following the introduction of U.S. tariff policies.

##### **Gross Profit**

The Group's gross profit decreased by approximately S\$1.18 million from S\$2.70 million in 1H2025 to approximately S\$1.52 million in 1H2026. The decrease in gross profit was mainly contributed by lower sales volumes in the metal stamping and tooling segments, which reduced production efficiency and economies of scale.

##### **Other Income**

Other income increased by approximately S\$144,000 from approximately S\$274,000 in 1H2025 to approximately S\$418,000 in 1H2026. The increase in other income is mainly due to gain in disposal of fixed assets and disposal of asset classified as asset held for sale, as well as higher rental income.

##### **Marketing and distribution expenses**

Marketing and distribution expenses stayed constant, with a slight increase of approximately S\$1,000 from approximately S\$143,000 in 1H2025 to approximately S\$144,000 in 1H2026 due to an increase in mandatory contributions, salary adjustments and travelling expenses.

##### **Administrative and other expenses**

Administrative and other expenses decreased by approximately S\$380,000 from approximately S\$2.68 million in 1H2025 to approximately S\$2.30 million in 1H2026, primarily due to lower manpower expenses and reduced exchange losses. This was partially offset by higher depreciation, fixed assets written off, bank charges due to the disposal of properties, higher repair and maintenance expenses and transaction taxes.

##### **Finance costs**

Finance costs decreased from approximately S\$64,000 in 1H2025 to approximately S\$39,000 in 1H2026 following the redemption of three property loans during the period. Finance costs comprise of interest expenses on borrowings and lease liabilities.

##### **Tax expense**

Tax expense increased to approximately S\$80,000 in 1H2026 compared to a tax expense of approximately S\$70,000 in 1H2025. This is due to taxable profits for one of the subsidiaries.

### **Loss for the period**

As a result, the Group is reporting a net loss after tax of approximately S\$630,000 for 1H2026 as compared to the profit after tax of approximately S\$11,000 in 1H2025 which mainly arose from the decrease in revenue.

### **Review of consolidated statement of financial position (31 December 2025 vs. 30 June 2025)**

#### **Non-current assets**

The decrease in non-current assets of approximately S\$0.16 million, stemmed from the decrease in property, plant and equipment from approximately S\$5.69 million as at 30 June 2025 to approximately S\$5.61 million as at 31 December 2025. This decrease was due mainly to a depreciation charge of approximately S\$567,000 and foreign translation differences offset by purchase of property, plant & equipment of approximately S\$245,000.

Intangible assets were approximately S\$23,000 as at 30 June 2025 and decreased to approximately S\$20,000 as at 31 December 2025, due to amortisation of approximately S\$3,000.

#### **Current assets**

Inventories decreased from approximately S\$3.60 million as at 30 June 2025 to approximately S\$3.26 million as at 31 December 2025, due to inventories released for production and lower sales orders.

Trade receivables decreased from approximately S\$4.51 million as at 30 June 2025 to approximately S\$4.16 million as at 31 December 2025. The decrease was mainly due to lower sales receivables, timing of billing and collection of accounts during the financial period.

Other receivables consist mainly of deposits and prepayments. Other receivables and prepayments decreased by approximately S\$48,000 from approximately S\$286,000 as at 30 June 2025 to approximately S\$238,000 as at 31 December 2025, mainly due to lower deposit receivables, lower interest receivables and other debtors.

#### **Current liabilities**

Trade payables decreased from approximately S\$2.12 million as at 30 June 2025 to approximately S\$1.81 million as at 31 December 2025. This was mainly due to fewer purchases of materials for production resulting from lower sales and payments to suppliers.

Contract liabilities increased from approximately S\$143,000 as at 30 June 2025 to approximately S\$248,000 as at 31 December 2025 as a result of services not yet performed.

Other payables decreased from approximately S\$2.16 million as at 30 June 2025 to approximately S\$1.29 million as at 31 December 2025. This was mainly due to payment to other creditors, accruals and utilization of provisions.

#### **Borrowings and lease liabilities**

Total borrowings and total lease liabilities decreased from S\$2.85 million as at 30 June 2025 to S\$714,000 as at 31 December 2025. The decrease was mainly due to full settlement of loan arising from the disposal of properties during the period and payment of lease liabilities.

## **Review of Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows**

### **1H2026 vs. 1H2025**

For the six months ended 31 December 2025, the Group's net cash used in operating activities was approximately S\$456,000, while 1H2025 net cash generated from operating activities was approximately S\$1.01 million.

The operating cash flow before working capital changes decreased from approximately S\$434,000 in 1H2025 to approximately (S\$250,000) in 1H2026, contributed by lower revenue resulting in net loss before tax of approximately S\$550,000, after depreciation charge, interest expenses, inventories written down, which was offset by interest income and inventories written back.

Higher trade payables, contract liabilities and other payables and foreign translation differences offset by lower inventories, lower trade receivables and prepayments have resulted in a decrease in the cash generated from operations of approximately S\$1.38 million in 1H2025 to cash used in operations of approximately S\$405,000 in 1H2026.

Net cash generated from investing activities amounted to approximately S\$2.64 million in 1H2026 as compared to approximately S\$91,000 in 1H2025. The net cash flow generated in 1H2026 was mainly due to the proceeds from disposal of property, plant and equipment, and disposal of asset classified as asset held for sale. This was offset by the acquisition of new property, plant and equipment amounting to S\$245,000.

Net cash used in financing activities was approximately S\$2.18 million in 1H2026. This was mainly attributed to:

- a. repayment of borrowings of approximately S\$2.10 million
- b. payment on lease liabilities of approximately S\$117,000
- c. interest payment of approximately S\$39,000
- d. Proceeds from borrowings of approximately S\$43,000
- e. Increase in fixed deposit – pledged of approximately S\$11,000
- f. Decrease in restricted balance in use of approximately S\$36,000

As a result of the above, the Group's cash and cash equivalents increased from approximately S\$11.31 million as at 31 December 2024 to approximately S\$11.49 million as at 31 December 2025.

The past six months have been characterised by prolonged uncertainty, particularly relating to U.S. tariff policies, which have adversely affected global business conditions. These developments have resulted in increased costs, supply chain disruptions, and a contraction in global trade, further exacerbated by the ongoing Russia–Ukraine conflict. These effects have applied downward pressure on the profit margins.

This prolonged uncertainty has negatively impacted the Group's sales performance, as reflected in this report. While a significant recovery is not anticipated in the near half year, the Group expects an improvement in performance in the later months.
