(i) **Paragraph (e)**

A conviction under Section 157(1) of the Companies Act (Chapter 50) on 6 October 2008.

(ii) **Paragraph (f)**

A civil proceedings in High Court Suit No. 160/2010/W commenced by Loh Yong Lim and his wife, Lim Siew Juat in February 2010 involving allegations of misrepresentation and misuse of position of trust and confidence. The claim was vigorously defended and was resolved through mediation in April 2011.

(iii) **Paragraph (h)**

On 6 October 2008, I pleaded guilty to a charge under Section 157(1) of the Companies Act (Cap 50) for failing to use reasonable diligence as an Independent Director to disclose a change in effective control of Chuan Soon Huat Industrial Group, which was then listed on the main board of the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited.

I was fined \$5,000.00 and was disqualified from acting as a company director for (2) two years under Section 154(2) (b) of the Companies Act from the 6 October 2008.

On 17 February 2009, pursuant to an appeal to the High Court under Magistrate Appeal No 253/2008/01, the High Court reduced the disqualification period to (1) one year.

(iv) **Paragraph (j)(I)**

I was investigated by the Commercial Affairs Department in October 2006 in relation to my involvement as an Independent Director of Chuan Soon Huat Industrial Group Ltd, which subsequently led to my conviction under Section 157(1) of the Companies Act (Chapter 50) on 6 October 2008.

(v) **Paragraph (k)**

A complaint was lodged against me for professional misconduct under Section 85 (1) of the Legal Profession Act by Loh Yong Lim (the “**Complainant**”) on 25 February 2010.

The complaint was dismissed by the Law Society on 31 January 2011 on the basis that:-

- (a) there was no cogent evidence of any false representation made by me to the Complainant; and
- (b) there was no evidence that I had conducted myself in any manner which was unbecoming of an Advocate and Solicitor.
