E. NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND OTHER INFORMATION

1. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The condensed interim consolidated statement of financial position of Memiontec Holdings Ltd. (the "Company") and its subsidiaries (the "Group") as at 30 June 2024 and the related condensed interim consolidated profit or loss and other comprehensive income, condensed interim consolidated statement of changes in equity and condensed interim consolidated statement of cash flows for the six-month period ended 30 June 2024 and certain explanatory notes have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore.

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and the Group's performance since the last audited consolidated financial statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 December 2023.

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted are consistent with those adopted by the Company in the most recently audited consolidated financial statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 December 2023, which were prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) ("SFRS(I)s") and Interpretations of SFRS(I) ("SFRS(I) INT"), except for the adoption of new and revised SFRS(I)s and SFRS(I) INTs which are relevant to the Group's operations and become effective for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2024. The adoption of these new and revised standards and interpretations does not result in changes to the accounting policies of the Group and the Company and has no material effect on the amounts reported for the current or prior period.

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements are presented in Singapore Dollar ("S\$") which is the Company's functional currency. All financial information presented in S\$ have been rounded to the nearest thousand, unless otherwise stated.

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements for the six-month period ended 30 June 2024 have been prepared on a going concern basis, since management has verified that there are no financial, operating or other types of indicators that might cast significant doubt upon the Group's ability to meet its obligations in the foreseeable future and particularly within the 12 months from the end of the reporting period.

1.1 WHETHER THE FIGURES HAVE BEEN AUDITED OR REVIEWED AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH WHICH AUDITING STANDARD

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements for the six-month period ended 30 June 2024 have not been audited or reviewed by the Company's auditors.

1.2 AUDIT OPINION ON LATEST FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Group's latest audited consolidated financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2023 were not subject to an adverse opinion, qualified opinion or disclaimer of opinion issued by the Company's auditors on 5 April 2024.

1.3 CRITICAL ACCOUNTING JUDGEMENTS AND KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

In preparing the condensed interim consolidated financial statements, management is required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the most recently audited consolidated financial statements as at and for the financial year ended 31 December 2023.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, are as follows:

- Revenue recognition of Total Solutions with Engineering, Procurement and Construction (TSEPC)
 contracts:
- Estimated impairment of trade receivables, other receivables and contract assets;
- Impairment of investments in subsidiaries and joint venture:
- Income tax and deferred tax; and
- Valuation of financial asset, at FVOCI.

Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

1.4 SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent to 30 June 2024, there are no known subsequent events that may have a material effect on the condensed interim consolidated financial statements of the Group.

Revenue for 1H2024 was higher than 1H2023 mainly due to higher contributions from the TSEPC and SDS business segments in the period under review, partially offset by the decrease in revenue contributed by the OMS and SOW business segments.

Revenue for TSPEC business segment for 1H2024 was S\$2.4 million (9.4%) higher than 1H2023 due to the higher revenue contribution from Singapore's TSEPC operations.

In Singapore, TSEPC revenue for 1H2024 was S\$22.0 million (1H2023: S\$17.9 million), accounting for 77.7% of the Group's total TSEPC revenue in 1H2024. This was due to a higher volume of work carried out in 1H2024 under the on-going contracts such as the Changi Water Reclamation Plant Phase 2 Contract ("C22C") and Odour Control and Air Jumper Facilities ("OCF").

The Group's TSEPC revenue from Indonesia decreased slightly to S\$6.3 million, accounting for 22.3% of the Group's total TSEPC revenue in 1H2024 (1H2023: S\$7.9 million) due to the successful completion of major projects in Indonesia during 1H2023.

(b) OMS Business Segment

Revenue from the OMS business segment decreased to S\$1.1 million in 1H2024 as compared to S\$1.5 million in 1H2023, mainly due to the lesser OMS contracts in 1H2024, as compared to the previous corresponding period under review.

(c) SDS Business Segment

SDS revenue for 1H2024 increased by S\$0.3 million (100.0%) due to higher sales volume during the period under review.

(d) SOW Business Segment

The Group's jointly operated water treatment plant in Indonesia sold a lower volume of treated water in 1H2024, resulting in the decrease in revenue by approximately S\$0.05 million (43.7%) for the SOW business segment, as compared to the previous corresponding period under review.

Gross Profit and Gross Profit Margin ("GPM")

The Group reported an increase in gross profit for 1H2024, mainly due to higher margins from the projects in Indonesia in 1H2024 as compared to 1H2023.

Correspondingly, the Group's GPM increased from 12.0% in 1H2023 to 14.0% in 1H2024.

In 1H2024, the Group received lower amounts of government grants as compared to 1H2023, mainly due to absence of grants for new markets penetration overseas in 1H2024.

In 1H2024, the Group recorded higher interest income generated from fixed deposits placement as compared to 1H2023.

In 1H2024, the Group recorded lesser net foreign exchange gain, mainly due to depreciation of Indonesian Rupiah against Singapore Dollar, as compared to a net foreign exchange gain of S\$0.1 million in 1H2023.

In 1H2024, the Group recognised S\$0.2 million (1H2023: S\$51,000) under sundry income for recovery of inventory and fixed assets from the completed projects.

Payroll costs increased mainly due to the increase in headcount in 1H2024, as compared to 1H2023.

Increase in directors' remuneration in 1H2024 was mainly due to reversal of over-provision of directors' bonuses for FY2022 in 1H2023, which was absent in 1H2024.

Rental expense incurred by the Group was higher in 1H2024 due to more units of dormitory rooms rented by the Group as a result of increase in headcount and higher rental rates for lease renewal.

Other costs increased mainly due to increase in overhead and general expenses in 1H2024 as compared to 1H2023.

Other than the above, there were no significant changes in general and administrative expenses incurred in 1H2024, as compared to 1H2023.

11.1.4 Finance Costs

Finance costs remained relatively stable in 1H2024 and 1H2023.

11.1.5 Share of profit of a joint venture

Share of profit of a joint venture relates to the Group's 40% interest in in its joint venture company, PT Jakpro Memiontec Air.

The joint venture has a BOOT water treatment plant at Hutan Kota, Jakarta. The Hutan Kota BOOT project has commenced the production and sale of treated water since December 2019. The increase in the share of profit in 1H2024 was due the higher volume of water produced during the period under review as compared to 1H2023.

11.1.6 Income tax expense

The effective income tax rate for 1H2024 was 19%, as compared to the effective income tax rate of 15% for 1H2023. The increase was mainly due to the higher contribution from Indonesia which has a higher tax rate.

11.1.7 Net profit for the period

As a result of the above, net profit of the Group for 1H2024 was S\$1.4 million (1H2023: S\$1.3 million).

The Group recorded a positive working capital position of S\$20.9 million as at 30 June 2024 (S\$17.7 million as at 31 December 2023).

11.3. Review of the Group's cash flows

11.3.1 Operating activities

Net cash generated from operating activities amounted to \$\$0.9 million in 1H2024 (1H2023: \$\$0.4 million), mainly due to decrease in contract assets, which relate to the Group's right to consideration upon completion of work.

11.3.2 Investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities amounted to S\$2.4 million in 1H2024 (1H2023: S\$0.2 million), mainly due to addition of construction-in-progress for a new BOOT project in Indonesia.

11.3.3 Financing activities

Net cash generated from financing activities amounted to S\$4.4 million in 1H2024 (1H2023: net cash used in financing activities amounted to S\$0.4 million) was mainly due to drawdown of borrowings of S\$15.3 million in 1H2024 (1H2023: S\$0.7 million), partially offset by the repayment of external borrowings amounting to S\$11.4 million in 1H2024 (1H2023: S\$1.0 million).

As at 30 June 2024, the Group has an order book of approximately S\$44.8 million. Most of these projects are expected to be substantially completed within the next 2 years. The Group anticipates a speed up in project execution for certain key projects in the next 12 months.

In Singapore, it is anticipated that tenders of larger scale public tenders relating to membrane processes and Mechanical, Electrical, Instrument, Control and Automation works for water reclamation plants and other water works will be undertaken by PUB. The Group will participate in such tender exercises as appropriate and viable.

Indonesia remains an important market for the Group given the emphasis and development of its water treatment capacity. The Group is actively involved in evaluating build, own, operate and transfer (BOOT), build, own and operate (BOO), and Total Solutions Engineering Procurement Construction (TSEPC) projects and remains competitive, with the Group's core competencies, in securing favourable projects.

Through Memiontec Company Limited (the Company's wholly-owned subsidiary in Vietnam), the Group continues to actively participate in bids for water projects in Vietnam.

The current high interest rate environment and currency volatility may have an impact on the funding and implementation of water infrastructure projects. The Group will therefore continue to operate with care and prudence due to the uncertain macroeconomic and geopolitical factors.
