### **Basslink receives Notice of Dispute from the State of Tasmania**

Further to our media statement of 22 March 2018, Basslink Pty Ltd (Basslink) has today received the Notice of Dispute (Notice) issued under the Basslink Operations Agreement (BOA) from the State of Tasmania.

The Notice raises substantially the same issues as set out in the letter which Basslink received from the State on 21 March 2018.

Basslink strongly denies the allegations set out in the Notice.

Basslink will follow the dispute resolution steps set out in the BOA to resolve the dispute. However, if the dispute cannot be resolved, it would be referred to arbitration in accordance with the steps of the BOA, and Basslink intends to vigorously defend the matters raised in the Notice.
