Central Park Sydney now home to 'Best Tall Building Worldwide'

One Central Park wins global award from CTBUH, Chicago

Sydney, 11 November 2014 – Sydney can now claim having the 'Best Tall Building Worldwide' with One Central Park, designed by French architecture practice Ateliers Jean Nouvel in collaboration with Australian firm, PTW, taking out the highly coveted prize by the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat (CTBUH) in Chicago, USA.

Central Park's Development Director, Mick Caddey, said this is one of the biggest accolades a building can receive on a global level in terms of design integrity; placing One Central Park in an elite collection of the world's best new buildings.

"Frasers Property, together with our joint venture partners Sekisui House Australia, is tremendously proud of the international and local design and delivery team who worked together to achieve this outstanding outcome.

"International awards such as this one continue to reinforce the extraordinary design credentials of Central Park and to demonstrate what can be achieved by collaboration with multiple design partners: something truly extraordinary and world-leading.

"Sydney can now lay claim to having the best tall building in the world, which by anyone's standards is an impressive claim to make," Mr Caddey added.

"Awards such as these are important to our entire Central Park community – many of whom bought into Central Park off the plan – affirming their bold decision to invest within this visionary precinct."

One Central Park won the CTBUH's 'Best Tall Building in Asia and Australasia' award earlier in June and was in contention for 'Best Tall Building Worldwide' with three other regional winners: Edith Green-Wendell Wyatt Federal Building, Portland, USA (Americas); De Rotterdam, Rotterdam, Netherlands (Europe); and Cayan Tower, Dubai, UAE (Middle East & Africa).

Juror and Executive Director of the CTBUH, Antony Wood, said: "Seeing this project for the first time stopped me dead. There have been major advances in the incorporation of greenery in high-rise buildings over the past few years – but nothing on the scale of this building has been attempted or achieved. One Central Park strongly points the way forward, not only for an essential naturalization of our built environment, but for a new aesthetic for our cities – an aesthetic entirely appropriate to the environmental challenges of our age."

The Council received 88 entries from around the world for the Best Tall Building awards. The largest number of entries was from Asia, with a significant number also from Europe.





The Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat is the world's leading resource for professionals focused on the design and construction of tall buildings and future cities.

Joint venture partners, Frasers Property Australia and Sekisui House Australia, completed One Central Park in December 2013. One Central Park comprises 623 apartments in two adjoining towers linked by a recreation podium including a major new urban shopping centre.

Architect Jean Nouvel of Ateliers Jean Nouvel said it was a tremendous honour for One Central Park to be recognised on the international stage for the integrity and uniqueness of its design.

"This is a remarkable achievement for the entire design and project management team," said Nouvel.

One Central Park features Nouvel's signature – a monumental cantilever – expressed as a Sky Garden extending from level 29 of One Central Park's taller East tower. It's an extraordinary building: the cantilever supports a visually arresting light-reflecting heliostat system, while the largest *en masse* vertical gardens in the world – covering 1,100 sqm and designed by artists and botanist Patrick Blanc – clad the exterior facades.

The unique heliostat design feature is the first of its kind to be used in a residential context in Australia and the largest of its type in the world used in an urban environment.

One Central Park has also been an overwhelming commercial success with the majority of the 623 apartments sold off the plan.

However, a handful of recently released two-storey penthouse apartments – known as Sky at One Central Park – remain for sale, priced from A\$2.65 million. It's a rare opportunity to secure a place within the Best Tall Building in the World.
