E. Notes to the condensed interim consolidated financial statements

1. Corporate information

F J Benjamin Holdings Ltd (the Company) is a limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in Singapore and is listed on the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited (SGX-ST). These condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the six months and full year ended 30 June 2021 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (the Group).

The principal activities of the Company are those of investment holding and the provision of management services to its subsidiaries. The principal activities of the subsidiaries are those of investment holding and importers, distributors and retailers of consumer fashion wear, accessories and timepieces.

2. Basis of preparation

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements for the six months and full year ended 30 June 2021 have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group since the last interim financial statements for the period ended 31 December 2020.

The accounting policies and methods of computations adopted for the condensed interim consolidated financial statements are consistent with those adopted by the Company in its most recently audited annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2020, which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1 below.

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements are presented in Singapore dollar which is the Company's functional currency.

For the financial year ended 30 June 2021, the Group incurred a net loss of \$10.9 million (2020: \$15.0 million). The condensed interim consolidated financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as directors of the Company are of the view that the Group will be able to continue to generate net cash inflows from operating activities for a period of 12 months from the date these financial statements were approved, to meet their financial obligations as and when they fall due.

2.1 New and amended standards adopted by the Group

A number of amendments to the standards have become applicable for the current reporting period. The Group did not have to change its accounting policies or make retrospective adjustments as a result of adopting these standards. The adoption of these standards did not have any material effect on the financial performance or position of the Group and the Company.

2.2 Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the condensed interim consolidated financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the most recently audited annual consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2020.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on on-going basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

3. Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period reported on.

4. Segment and revenue information

For management purpose, the Group is organised into business units based on their channel of distribution and has three reportable operating segments as follows:

- i. The Ongoing Retail segment is involved in the operation of retail stores specialising in the retail of consumer fashion wear, accessories and timepieces.
- ii. The Distribution segment is involved in the distribution of consumer fashion wear, accessories, home furnishings, timepieces and health and wellness.
- iii. The Export segment is involved in the export of the consumer fashion wear, accessories and timepieces.

These operating segments are reported in the manner consistent with internal reporting provided to management who are responsible for allocating resources and assessing performance of the operating segments.

4. Review of performance of the Group

(i) Review of Results for Full Year Ended 30 June 2021 (FY2021)

The COVID-19 outbreak continued to impact the retail industry across South-east Asia as governments imposed intermittent lockdowns and social distancing measures during the year under review. Malaysia and Indonesia bore the brunt of these lockdowns amid the highly transmissible Delta variant which started hitting the region in May 2021. The various "on and off" safe management measures affected consumer sentiment, resulting in reduced spending at retail malls.

Singapore implemented the Phase 2 Heightened Alert restrictions beginning 16 May 2021 with reduced mall capacity and no dine-in at food and beverage outlets before gradually relaxing the restrictions and allowing dine-in for two persons from 21 June 2021. Malaysia announced various restrictions throughout the year with a complete lockdown beginning 1 June 2021 before gradually allowing stores to be opened from 17 August 2021. Indonesia had several partial lockdowns during the year with tightened mobility restrictions from 22 June 2021 when malls and dine-in outlets could only operate at 25 per cent capacity.

Group revenue fell 28%, from \$92.9 million for the last financial year ended 30 June 2020 ("FY2020") to \$66.8 million for the current financial year ended 30 June 2021 ("FY2021"). Net loss after tax narrowed to \$10.9 million in FY2021 (FY2020: \$15.0 million), after providing for (i) allowances for expected credit losses on receivables from the Group's Indonesia associate and related party of associate, and write down in value of investment in associate, totalling \$2.8 million (FY2020: \$4.1 million); and (ii) impairment of fixed assets and right-of-use assets of \$0.2 million (FY2020: \$0.2 million).

Sales in Singapore (excluding exports to Indonesia) and Malaysia were down as compared to FY2020, when the first half results reflected pre-COVID-19 trading conditions. During FY2021, Singapore saw a 6% decline and Malaysia, 35%.

Sales at the Group's Indonesia associate, which fell 20%, were hurt by the capping of mall capacity at 25%, as the country went into various partial lockdowns as virus infections surged. Consequently, exports to Indonesia from Singapore were lower at \$4.2 million, as compared to \$5.3 million last year. The Group's share of losses in associate was \$2.4 million, down from \$5.3 million recorded in the previous financial year, helped by major cost cutting measures and rental rebates received from landlords.

Gross profit margin improved marginally to 50.5% in FY2021 (FY2020: 50.1%).

Group operating expenses fell 22% to \$40.1 million, primarily from lower staff commission paid, reduced warehouse and logistics charges, rental waivers and rebates given by landlords.

The Group recorded other income of \$2.3 million, comprising mainly temporary wage credits given by governments to help employers during the economic downturn.

An allowance for expected credit losses and impairment of investment in the Group's Indonesia associate amounting to \$2.8 million was booked after an assessment of recoverability of the investment and trade and other receivables. The assessment took into consideration the continued impact of COVID-19 on the Indonesian economy and the associate's business performance. Last year's impairment was \$4.1 million.

Since announcing the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding with Lazada in March 2021, the Group has added several new brands to its online business either on mono-sites or on Lazada. Revenue from e-commerce has since grown to 4% of total revenue from 1% the year before.

The Group's warrants expired on 5 April 2021, and upon the exercise by warrant-holders, the Group raised net proceeds of \$6.3 million. As announced on 17 May 2021, a total of \$4.9 million has been utilised, leaving a balance of \$1.4 million unutilised as at 30 June 2021.

(ii) Balance sheet

The Group cut back on forward purchases and reduced inventory as at 30 June 2021 to \$26.5 million, down from \$29.2 million as at 30 June 2020.

Net borrowings totalled \$10.6 million as at 30 June 2021, down from \$13.0 million as at 30 June 2020. Gearing stood at 32% as at 30 June 2021 (30 June 2020: 34%).

(iiI) Cash Flows

For the financial year under review, the Group generated net cash flows of \$10.5 million from operating activities and invested \$0.5 million in shop fittings. Proceeds from warrant conversion amounted to \$6.3 million, and after utilisation leaving a net balance of \$1.4 million which contributed to the cash balance of \$12.2 million as at 30 June 2021.

The coronavirus pandemic has posed significant challenges for the fashion retail industry in the region in the last 18 months. Whilst management does not expect consumer spending in the Group's key markets to recover to pre-COVID-19 levels anytime soon, with the easing of restrictions in malls and food and beverage outlets, traffic is expected to gradually improve.

Management will not let up on efforts to manage costs where possible, and will, for example, continue to review lease agreements to ensure rentals are in line with the market outlook. The Group's ecommerce business is looking promising not only in terms of its growth but also its synergistic effect on our brick-and-mortar store network and the aim is to ensure that our physical stores become a natural extension of the online experience.

The Group has diversified into the health and wellness sector and has started distributing Airfree purifiers/ sterilisers last year which has shown promising results. Management is exploring opportunities to add new and complementary products as we see wellness and hygiene to be an important engine of growth in the coming years.
