- (1) The RMB2,608 million represents the final dividend of 12.0 Singapore cents per ordinary share in respect of the financial year ended 31 December 2024. The Company paid the dividend on 13 May 2025.
- (2) In 1H2025, the Company bought back 15,000,000 shares of the Company by way of market acquisition, which are held as treasury shares.
- (3) This represents amounts set aside for reserve fund and enterprise expansion fund in compliance with local laws in the PRC where subsidiaries of the Group operate. The reserve fund can only be used, upon approval by the relevant authority, to offset prior year's losses or to increase capital while the enterprise expansion fund can only be used to increase capital upon approval by the relevant authority.
- (4) The capital injection by non-controlling interest of RMB15 million represents the capital injection by the non-controlling interest of Jiangsu Yangzi Chengkang Marine Heavy Industry Co., Ltd., a 50% owned subsidiary of the Group.

## E. Notes to the Condensed Consolidated Interim Financial Statements

## 1. Corporate information

Yangzijiang Shipbuilding (Holdings) Ltd. (the "Company") is listed on the Singapore Exchange and incorporated and domiciled in Singapore. The address of its registered office is 36 Robinson Road, #20-01 City House, Singapore 068877. The principal place of business is 9 Raffles Place, #54-01, Republic Plaza, Singapore 048619.

The principal activities of the Company are investment holding and agency service for shipbuilding and related activities. The principal activities of its significant subsidiaries are:

- a) Shipbuilding, production and processing of large-scale steel structures;
- b) Facilitating the sale and export of ships for the shipbuilder and trading of ship related equipment;
- c) Chartering of vessels; and
- d) Holding of investment property.

## 2. Basis of Preparation

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements as at and for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 have been prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting (SFRS(I) 1-34) issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group since the last consolidated annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new or amended standards effective as of 1 January 2025 as set out in Note 2.1.

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements are presented in Renminbi ("RMB"), which is the Company's functional currency.

## 2.1. New or amended standards adopted by the Group

## 2.2. Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the condensed consolidated interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

#### 3. Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period.

## 4. Segment and revenue information

Management has determined the operating segments based on the reports reviewed by the Executive Chairman and head of respective business departments (collectively known as "Management Team") that are used to make strategic decisions.

The principal activities of shipbuilding segment are that of shipbuilding and offshore marine equipment construction. The principal activities of shipping segment consist of charter hire income earned by vessel owning companies.

Other segments include terminal services, trading, ship design services, sales of residential units, and investment property. These are not identified as reportable operating segments, as they are not separately reported to the Management Team. The results of these operations are included in "Others".

Information regarding the Group's reportable segments is presented in the following table.

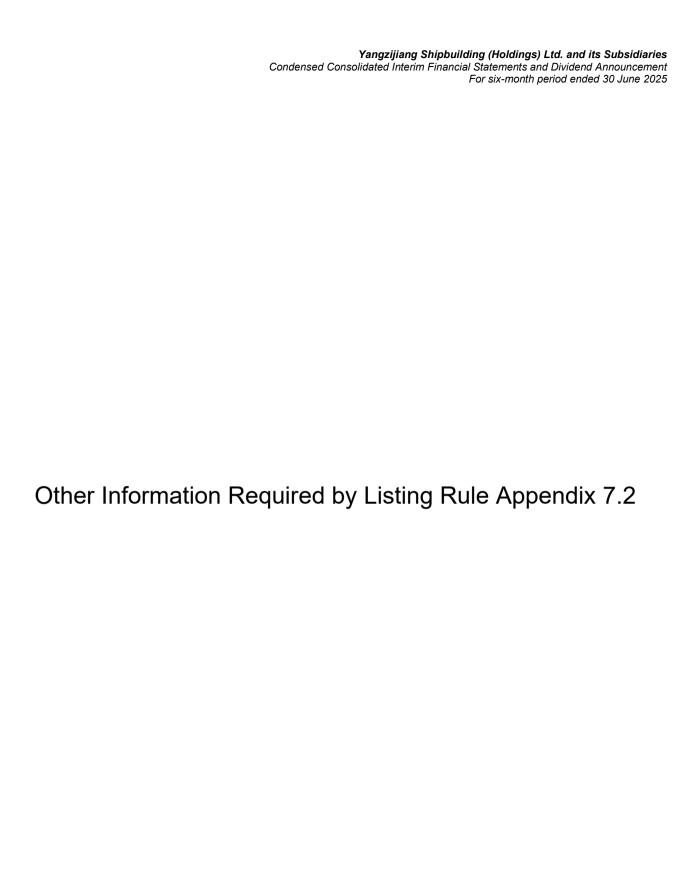

## Revenue

In 1H2025, the Group successfully delivered a total of 23 vessels on schedule, including 4 delivered by its joint venture, Yangzi-Mitsui Shipbuilding Co., Ltd. ("Yangzi-Mitsui"). This compares to 35 vessels delivered in 1H2024, of which 7 were contributed by the joint venture. Shipbuilding revenue for the period was slightly lower at RMB12,249 million, compared to RMB12,398 million in 1H2024, primarily due to the commencement of construction for oil tankers, which carry a lower average unit price compared to containerships. However, the impact of the lower revenue contribution from oil tankers was largely offset by revenue from the construction of large dual-fuel containerships.

Revenue from the shipping business declined by 15% year-on-year to RMB511 million in 1H2025, mainly due to weaker charter rates during the period.

The Group is also engaged in various other businesses, including terminal services, trading, ship design services, and investment property. Revenue from these segments rose significantly from RMB46 million in 1H2024 to RMB117 million in 1H2025, primarily driven by higher trading volumes. The increase in trading activity was largely attributable to the sale of raw materials to Tsuneishi Group (Zhoushan) Shipbuilding Co., Ltd. ("Tsuneishi Zhoushan"), a 34%-owned associated company of the Group.

Following the commencement of the LNG terminal conversion project and renovation works at the Singapore office building held as an investment property, revenue contributions from terminal services and investment property will be temporarily suspended. In 1H2025, the Group recognised revenue of RMB20 million from the sale of residential units held under Jiangsu Yangxing Property Co., Ltd., a subsidiary acquired in 1H2024. The units were primarily sold to employees.

## Operating cost

Cost of sales for the shipbuilding business decreased by 14% year-on-year to RMB7,932 million in 1H2025, compared to RMB9,183 million in 1H2024. This reduction was primarily driven by lower steel costs, and a change in product mix with a higher contribution from oil tankers, which generally have lower costs compared to containerships. There was no allowance or reversal of allowance for losses recognised on onerous contracts during the period.

The operating costs for the shipping business segment were higher than the costs incurred during the same period last year. This increase can be attributed to the increased repair and maintenance activities, leading to higher operating expenses during the current period.

#### Gross profit

In 1H2025, the Group's shipbuilding business achieved a significant improvement in gross profit margin, increasing from 26% in 1H2024 to 35% in 1H2025. This improvement was primarily driven by lower steel costs, successful execution of secured contracts with improved pricing, and the smooth delivery of large dual-fuel containerships.

The shipping business segment recorded a gross profit margin of 26% in 1H2025, compared to 41% in 1H2024, reflecting the impact of weak charter rates for bulk carriers during the period.

Condensed Consolidated Interim Financial Statements and Dividend Announcement For six-month period ended 30 June 2025

Other businesses, including terminal services, trading, ship design services, and investment property, recorded a gross profit margin of 0% in 1H2025, down from 54% in 1H2024. This decrease was primarily due to a higher proportion of low-margin trading activities during the period, as well as a one-off impairment loss of RMB7 million on inventory related to properties held under Jiangsu Yangxing Property Co., Ltd.

#### Other income

The "Other income" category primarily comprises interest income from bank deposits, interest income from ship finance leases, and income from the sale of bunker stock.

In 1H2025, interest income experienced growth, rising from RMB332 million in 1H2024 to RMB486 million. This increase was primarily driven by higher interest income from bank deposits, resulting from a rise in cash and cash equivalents held by the Group during the same period.

#### Other gains/(losses) - net

The category of "Other gains/(losses) - net" encompasses several components, including foreign exchange-related gains/losses, fair value changes on derivative financial instruments and financial assets at fair value through profit or loss, gain on disposal of property, plant, and equipment as well as subsidy income.

In 1H2025, the Group recorded total other gains of RMB139 million, compared to other losses of RMB119 million in 1H2024. The net gains were mainly driven by foreign exchange gains of RMB67 million, fair value gains of RMB7 million on derivative financial instruments, subsidy income of RMB41 million, and a gain of RMB6 million from the disposal of property, plant and equipment, which primarily related to the sale of two barge carriers by the shipping segment during the period.

## **Expenses**

In 1H2025, total administrative expenses increased to RMB358 million, compared to RMB278 million in 1H2024. The increase was primarily attributable to higher research and development expenses.

In 1H2025, the finance cost increased to RMB65 million from RMB59 million in 1H2024. This increase is attributed to the Group's higher bank borrowing during the same period.

## Share of results of associated companies and joint ventures

The "Share of results of associated companies and joint ventures" represents the portion of results attributed to the Group's associated companies and joint ventures. In 1H2025, this amounted to RMB481 million, primarily comprising share of profit of RMB320 million from the Group's joint venture, Yangzi-Mitsui, and share of profit of RMB160 million from Tsuneishi Zhoushan, a 34%-owned associated company newly invested by the Group in 1H2025.

#### Corporate income Tax

In line with the higher profit before tax, income tax expenses for 1H2025 increased to RMB988 million, compared to RMB606 million in 1H2024. The Group's effective tax rate for 1H2025 was 19.1%, higher than the 16.5% recorded in the same period last year. The lower effective tax rate in 1H2024 was mainly due to a one-off reversal of RMB123 million in overprovision of income tax relating to prior years.

#### **Statements of Financial Position Review**

### <u>Assets</u>

As at 30 June 2025, cash and cash equivalents declined to RMB24,355 million, from RMB28,120 million as at 31 December 2024. The decrease was primarily driven by cash outflows related to investing and financing activities.

Restricted cash, which is primarily earmarked as deposits for performance guarantees, letters of credit, and regulatory reserve accounts, decreased from RMB20 million as at 31 December 2024 to RMB16 million as at 30 June 2025. The reduction was mainly due to the progressive release of funds held in an escrow account under Jiangsu Yangxing Property Co., Ltd., following the final construction acceptance of the residential project in 1Q2025, in accordance with local government requirements.

The investment in financial assets, at fair value through profit or loss, decreased to RMB13 million from RMB18 million as of 31 December 2024. This decrease was mainly due to the disposal of RMB8 million in 1H2025 with a fair value gain of RMB3 million.

Current trade and other receivables increased from RMB6,270 million as of 31 December 2024 to RMB7,290 million as of 30 June 2025. This increase was primarily driven by higher prepayments for equipment to suppliers.

Inventory increased to RMB2,965 million as at 30 June 2025, up from RMB1,876 million as at 31 December 2024. The increase was primarily attributable to the rise in work-in-progress related to two 175,000 CBM LNG carriers, following the termination of their shipbuilding contracts in 2024.

Contract assets decreased to RMB5,571 million as of 30 June 2025 from RMB5,843 million as of 31 December 2024, primarily due to the progressive delivery of vessels during the period.

The current derivative financial assets of RMB11 million mainly represented the fair values of USD/CNY forward contracts with positive valuation. These contracts were entered by the Group for non-hedging purpose to improve the USD/CNY exchange rate.

Investment in joint ventures increased from RMB908 million as at 31 December 2024 to RMB1,128 million as at 30 June 2025. The increase was primarily attributable to the share of profits of RMB320 million, mainly from the Group's joint venture, Yangzi-Mitsui, partially offset by the disposal of a 5% equity interest in Yangzi-Mitsui, amounting to RMB101 million in 1H2025.

As at 30 June 2025, investment in associated companies increased to RMB1,046 million, up from RMB59 million as at 31 December 2024. The increase was primarily due to the Group's investment of RMB833 million in Tsuneishi Zhoushan, a 34%-owned associated company, and the recognition of a share of profit of RMB160 million during the reporting period. This was partially offset by a capital return of RMB6 million following the dissolution of Jiangsu Run Yuan Energy Co., Ltd., a 30%-owned associated company, in 1H2025.

Investment property increased from RMB1,984 million as at 31 December 2024 to RMB2,173 million as at 30 June 2025. The increase was mainly due to an additional investment of RMB81 million following the commencement of renovation works in 2Q2025, as well as translation differences of RMB108 million arising from the appreciation of the SGD against CNY during the period.

Property, plant, and equipment increased from RMB7,863 million as at 31 December 2024 to RMB8,347 million as at 30 June 2025. The growth was mainly attributable to capital expenditure of RMB571 million incurred for the LNG terminal conversion project and the Hongyuan Yard, as well as additional investments of RMB149 million in existing yards. This was partially offset by the disposal of two barge carriers in February 2025.

Intangible assets, which mainly comprise computer software licenses, decreased from RMB21 million as at 31 December 2024 to RMB20 million as at 30 June 2025. The decrease was primarily due to amortisation during the period, partially offset by an addition of RMB1 million in 1H2025.

Deferred income tax assets decreased from RMB222 million as at 31 December 2024 to RMB197 million as at 30 June 2025. The decrease was mainly due to the tax impact arising from the net release of warranty provisions and fair value changes on derivative financial instruments during the period.

## Liabilities

As at 30 June 2025, current trade and other payables decreased to RMB3,575 million from RMB4,320 million as at 31 December 2024, mainly due to lower trade payables to suppliers, following the settlement of outstanding balances prior to the Chinese New Year.

As at 30 June 2025, current derivative financial liabilities amounted to RMB72 million, primarily representing the negative valuation of the USD/CNY forward contracts. These contracts were entered into by the Group to manage currency exposure arising from future USD-denominated receipts in the shipbuilding business and to enhance the effective USD/CNY exchange rate. The decrease from RMB230 million as at 31 December 2024 was mainly due to fair value movements and expiration of some USD/CNY forward contracts during the period.

The Group's borrowings, consisting entirely of unsecured loans, amounted to RMB6,050 million as at 30 June 2025, down from RMB6,800 million as at 31 December 2024. The decrease was primarily due to the net repayment of bank borrowings during the period.

As at 30 June 2025, current income tax liabilities increased to RMB938 million from RMB872 million as at 31 December 2024. The increase was primarily due to current income tax on profit for the period, partially offset by income tax payments made during the period.

As of 30 June 2025, deferred income tax liabilities increased to RMB1,092 million from RMB983 million as of 31 December 2024, primarily due to withholding tax provisions on the distributable profits of our subsidiaries in China during the financial period.

## Equity

The increase in "Total equity attributable to equity holders" to RMB27,738 million as of 30 June 2025 from RMB26,278 million as of 31 December 2024 was primarily driven by the profits earned during the year. The increase was partially offset by FY2024 dividend payment during the financial period.

#### Statements of Cash Flows Review

The decrease in cash and cash equivalents from RMB28,120 million to RMB24,355 million was primarily driven by cash outflows of RMB4,907 million related to investing and financing activities, partially offset by net cash inflows of RMB1,142 million from operating activities during the period.

Net cash used in investing activities amounted to RMB1,406 million in 1H2025. This was primarily driven by capital expenditure of RMB770 million, mainly related to the LNG terminal project and Hongyuan Yard, as well as an investment of RMB833 million in Tsuneishi Zhoushan. The outflows were partially offset by dividend income of RMB158 million received from the joint venture, Yangzi-Mitsui, and proceeds of RMB101 million from the disposal of a 5% equity interest in Yangzi-Mitsui during the period.

Net cash used in financing activities amounted to RMB3,501 million in 1H2025. This primarily included cash outflows of RMB2,608 million for the FY2024 dividend payment to equity holders, net repayment of bank borrowings totalling RMB750 million, and RMB158 million for the purchase of treasury shares. These outflows were partially offset by a capital injection of RMB15 million from the non-controlling shareholder of Jiangsu Yangzi Chengkang Marine Heavy Industry Co., Ltd., a 50%-owned subsidiary of the Group.

There have been some relatively positive developments in the tariff negotiations between the U.S. and some major economies like Japan, which the tariffs have now been capped at 15% from the previously proposed 25%. However, the newly agreed tariffs remain significantly higher than the 2.5% level in place before the Trump administration.

## Shipbuilding industry

According to BIMCO, global shipbuilding contracting fell by 54% year-on-year ("yoy") in 1H2025. The decline came amid growing concerns over the impact of the U.S. tariffs on global trade volumes. By vessel type, ordering activity for bulk carriers, tankers, and gas carriers slowed due to weaker freight rates, while demand for containerships remained relatively resilient.<sup>1</sup>

While shipowners may seek alternatives in response to the port fees proposed by the United States Trade Representative ("USTR"), capacity available outside of China remains limited. BIMCO highlighted that South Korea and Japan are facing challenges in scaling up production, primarily due to labour shortages from declining populations, which has led to rising labour costs and reduced competitiveness. Moreover, although the U.S. and India are building shipbuilding capacity led by government efforts, it will take time to scale up production meaningfully.

Long-term shipbuilding demand remains resilient, underpinned by the structural shift toward maritime decarbonisation. In April 2025, the International Maritime Organisation ("**IMO**") established the Net-zero Framework, which combines mandatory emissions limits and greenhouse gas ("**GHG**") pricing across the industry. The measures are set to be formally adopted in October 2025 before entry into force in 2027, will become mandatory for large oceangoing ships over 5,000 gross tonnages, which account for 85% of the total CO2 emissions from international shipping.<sup>2</sup>

## Shipping industry

During the period under review, the shipping industry experienced greater volatility, largely attributed to tariff shocks and geopolitical tensions. Notably, the Baltic Exchange Dry Index ("**BDI**") reached a twelve-month low at 715 points on 31 January 2025, while rebounding to a twelve-month high of 2,120 points on 23 July 2025<sup>3</sup>. This surge, driven by the increase in the capesize index, could signal a potential recovery of the shipping industry in 2H2025, although the outlook remains subject to macroeconomic conditions and market volatility.

With a fleet of 33 vessels, the Group will continue to adopt a flexible deployment strategy—seizing opportunities to lock in attractive time charters when appropriate, while maintaining spot exposure to optimise earnings and fleet agility.

## **Summary**

As tariff and trade talk progressions continue into 2H2025, uncertainty continues to weigh on market sentiment and global trade flows. Nonetheless, supported by a robust outstanding orderbook of US\$23.21 billion scheduled for progressively delivery from 2025 through 2029 and beyond, the Group remains cautiously optimistic. Leveraging its industry leadership, the Group stays closely attuned to market movements. As we move into 2H2025, increased clarity on tariff developments is expected to foster a more favourable environment sentiment. Well-positioned to capitalise on these opportunities, the Group is confident in securing new opportunities and endeavours to fill the remaining delivery slots for 2028 and 2029, which largely comprise of small to mid-sized vessels.
