GENERAL QUESTIONS

Unless otherwise defined, all capitalised terms used in this Annex which are not defined herein shall have the same meanings ascribed to them in the Company's Annual Report for the financial year ended 31 December 2025 ("Annual Report") and in the letter to the Shareholders of the Company dated 13 April 2026 ("Appendix").

1) How much of the orderbook on hand has clauses or room for discussion with clients with regards to increase of raw materials price such as oil and petrol?

In general, the Group's construction contracts include price fluctuation provisions for key construction materials (steel and concrete).

Further to the circular issued by the Building and Construction Authority dated 7 April 2026¹, the Government has introduced an ex-gratia cost-sharing arrangement for ongoing critical public sector construction projects where delays or stoppages would adversely affect public interest. Under this arrangement, the Government will co-share 50% of the direct additional costs incurred by contractors arising from the use of diesel and bitumen for the period from 1 March 2026 to 31 May 2026. The Group expects this to help alleviate upward cost pressures arising from increases in diesel and bitumen prices.

2) What is the number of staff at the end of 2024 and end of 2025. Of these amounts, how many are staff which require lodging in worker dormitories?

The Group's total headcount was 1,309 as at end-FY2025 and 1,261 as at end-FY2024. Of these, work permit holders are required to reside in approved worker dormitories. The Group is unable to disclose the specific number of such employees due to business sensitivity.

3) The lease of Tuas South Avenue 5 expires this year in November. Is the management looking for a new venue or is there a clause / room for discussion for potential extension?

The lease of the land at Tuas South Avenue 5 supports a certain project of the Group. The Group will look into the extension of the lease, where operationally required.

4) What is the total number of beds under operation for the 3 dormitories located at Lorong Bistari and Tengah Road?

The total operational bed capacity for the three dormitories located at Lorong Bistari and Tengah Road is 4,000 beds.
