1. Corporate information

The Company

TSH Corporation Limited is a limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in Singapore and is listed on the Catalist of the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited ("SGX-ST").

These condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the six months and financial year ended 31 December 2022 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the "**Group**").

The principal activities of the Company are that of investment holding and provision of management services. The principal activities of the Group are that of operation of food and beverages outlets and import and distribution of beverages.

2. Basis of preparation

The condensed interim financial statements for the six months and financial year ended 31 December 2022 have been prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) ("SFRS(I)") 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group since the last annual financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2021.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore dollar (SGD or \$) which is the Company's functional currency.

2.1 New and amended standards adopted by the Group

A number of amendments to Standards have become applicable for the current reporting period. The Group did not have to change the accounting policies or make retrospective adjustments as a result of adopting those standards.

2.2 Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the financial year ended 31 December 2021.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

2.2 Use of judgements and estimates (cont'd)

There is no critical judgement made in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements, or have a significant risk of resulting in a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial period.

2.3 Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of the reporting period are discussed below. The Group based its assumptions and estimates on parameters available when the financial statements were prepared. Existing circumstances and assumptions about future developments, however, may change due to market changes or circumstances arising beyond the control of the Group. Such changes are reflected in the assumptions when they occur.

Net realisable value of inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value ("NRV").

NRV in respect of inventories is assessed based on the best available facts and circumstances at the end of each reporting period, including but not limited to, the physical conditions of the inventories, their expected market selling prices and estimated costs to be incurred for their sale. The carrying amounts of the Group's inventories at the end of each reporting period are disclosed in the condensed interim financial statements.

Impairment of non-financial assets

The Group assesses whether there are indicators of impairment for plant and equipment and right-of-use assets at each reporting date. The Company also assesses whether there are indicators of impairment for investment in subsidiaries at each reporting date. These assets are tested for impairment where there are indications that the carrying amounts may not be recoverable. This requires an estimation of the recoverable amount of the cash generating units to which the assets belong which is determined based on the higher of fair value less cost to sell and value-in-use methods. In determining the recoverable amounts of the cash generating units, the Group evaluates, amongst other factors, the market and economic environment in which the cash generating units operate and the economic performance of these assets.

Management has determined that there is indication that the Group's carrying amounts of the plant and equipment and right-of-use assets of the non-performing outlets may be impaired.

The recoverable amounts of the plant and equipment, right-of-use assets and investment in subsidiaries have been determined based on value-in-use calculations using cash flow projections prepared by management. Key assumptions adopted in the value-in-use calculations include projections of revenue growth rate, gross profit margins, discount rates and long-term growth rates, where relevant. The pre-tax discount rate applied to cash flow projections is 9% (2021: 9%). For the financial year ended 31 December 2022, management recognised impairment losses on the Group's plant and equipment and right-of-use assets of \$0.03 million (2021: \$0.09 million) and \$0.15 million (2021: \$0.03 million) respectively, and reversed the impairment loss on the Company's investment in subsidiaries of \$4.58 million (2021: \$Nil) recognised in prior years.

The carrying amounts of the Group's plant and equipment, right-of-use assets and the Company's investment in subsidiaries at the end of each reporting period are disclosed in the condensed interim financial statements.

3. Seasonal operations

The Group businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial year.

4. Segment and revenue information

Information reported to the CEO for the purposes of resource allocation and assessment of segment performance is specifically focused on the wholesale and retail sale of food and beverages businesses which form the basis of identifying the operating segments of the Group under SFRS(I) 1-8 *Operating Segments*. Management considers the aggregated wholesale and retail sale of food and beverages businesses as a single operating segment.

Other Information Required by Catalist Rule Appendix 7C

1. Review

The condensed interim statements of financial position of TSH Corporation Limited and its subsidiaries as at 31 December 2022 and the related condensed interim consolidated statement of comprehensive income, condensed interim statements of changes in equity and condensed interim consolidated statement of cash flows for the six months and financial year then ended and the notes have not been audited or reviewed.

2. A review of the performance of the Group

Statement of comprehensive income

6 months period ended 31 December 2022 ("2H22") vs 6 months period ended 31 December 2021 ("2H21")

The Group's revenue for 2H22 increased by 115.9% or \$2.93 million to \$5.46 million from \$2.53 million in 2H21 due mainly to the relaxation of Covid-19 safe management restrictions on the dining capacity and alcohol consumption hours since first half 2022 as compared to the more stringent Covid-19 restrictions in the corresponding period, and the contribution from a new outlet (Capitol Cigar and Whisky Lounge) ("Capitol") managed by the Group since September 2022.

The gross profit of the Group for 2H22 increased by 136.2% or \$2.41 million to \$4.17 million from \$1.77 million in 2H21 in line with the increase in revenue. This was boosted by 6.6% increase in margin from 69.8% in 2H21 to 76.4% in 2H22 due mainly to better costs control and lower proportion of retail sales at the outlets, which yield lower margin, in 2H22.

The Group reported a profit after tax of \$0.53 million in 2H22 as compared to loss after tax of \$0.53 million in 2H21 due mainly to the higher revenue generated but moderated by higher expenses and lower other income. The higher expenses in 2H22 was mainly due to (i) increase in general and administrative expenses arising from the increase in operating activities and the opening of 2 new outlets, namely Capitol and Quaich Bar Wanderlust ("Wanderlust"), in 2H22 and higher manpower costs; (ii) higher selling and distribution expenses were incurred in 2H22 to boost sales; (iii) increase in other operating expenses in 2H22 due mainly to higher depreciation of right-of-use assets ("ROUA") as a result of the increase in ROUA in relation to new and renewed leases, and higher impairment of ROUA recognised for non-performing outlets. The increase in finance costs was due to the increase in interest expense on lease liabilities as a result of the increase in lease liabilities in relation to the new and renewed leases and the interest expense on discounting of non-current receivables. The lower other income in 2H22 was due mainly to lower government grants received.

12 months period ended 31 December 2022 ("**FY22**") vs 12 months period ended 31 December 2021 ("**FY21**")

The Group's revenue for FY22 increased by 72.4% or \$3.74 million to \$8.91 million from \$5.17 million in FY21 due mainly to the relaxation of the safe management measures since 1H22 and the contribution from the new outlet (Capitol) as mentioned above, but moderated by the absence of contribution from an outlet (Copper) upon the expiry of its lease in 2H21.

The gross profit of the Group for FY22 increased by 81.4% or \$3.03 million to \$6.74 million from \$3.72 million in FY21 due mainly to higher revenue generated. The gross margin increased by 3.7% from 71.9% in FY21 to 75.6% in FY22 attributed mainly to better costs control and lower proportion of retail sales at the outlets which yield lower margin in FY22.

The Group reported a profit before tax of \$0.91 million in FY22 as compared to a loss before tax of \$0.29 million in FY21 due to higher gross profit, but moderated by higher general and administrative expenses, selling and distribution expenses and finance costs, and lower other income in FY22.

The general and administrative expenses increased by \$1.01 million or 24.5% from \$4.12 million in FY21 to \$5.12 million in FY22 in line with the increase in operating activities and 2 new outlets opened in 2H22 as mentioned above, increase in manpower costs, and higher rental expenses as a result of short-term leases.

The selling and distribution expenses increased by \$0.11 million or 99.1% from \$0.11 million in FY21 to \$0.22 million in FY22 attributed mainly to higher marketing activities to boost sales.

The finance costs increased by \$0.05 million or 64.6% from \$0.08 million in FY21 to \$0.14 million in FY22 due mainly to the increase in interest expense on lease liabilities of \$0.02 million as a result of additions of lease liabilities in relation to the new and renewed leases and the interest expense on discounting of non-current receivables of \$0.03 million.

The other operating expenses for FY22 decreased marginally by \$8,000 or 1,1% due mainly to the decrease in depreciation and impairment of plant and equipment ("**PE**") by \$0.08 million and \$0.07 million respectively attributed mainly to fully depreciated PE and the impact of impairments made in prior years, but moderated by the increase in depreciation of ROUA in tandem with the additions of ROUA and impairment of ROUA for non-performing outlets by \$0.02 million and \$0.12 million respectively in FY22.

The other income decreased by \$0.66 million or 62.9% from \$1.05 million in FY21 to \$0.39 million in FY22 due mainly to lower government grants and landlord's rental rebates in FY22.

Consequently, the Group reports a profit for FY22 of \$0.85 million as compared to a loss of \$0.32 million in FY21.

Statement of financial position

The non-current assets of the Group increased by \$2.15 million to \$2.81 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$0.67 million as at 31 December 2021 due mainly to the increase in ROUA and other receivables, but moderated mainly by the decrease in deferred tax assets.

The ROUA increased by \$2.09 million to \$2.51 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$0.42 million as at 31 December 2021 due mainly to the additions of ROUA in relation to new and renewed leases, but partially offset by depreciation of \$0.49 million and impairment of \$0.15 million in FY22. The other receivables increased by \$0.13 million to \$0.19 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$0.06 million as at 31 December 2021 due mainly to the deposits paid for the new outlets and the reclassification of deposits of outlets from current assets to non-current assets upon renewal of their leases.

The current assets increased by \$0.88 million or 8.1% to \$11.71 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$10.83 million as at 31 December 2021 due to the increase in inventories, but moderated mainly by the decrease in cash and bank balances. The inventories increased by \$1.92 million or 35.2% to \$7.38 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$5.46 million as at 31 December 2021 attributed to the stocking up of whisky casks as well as the whisky bottles for sales.

The current liabilities increased by \$1.02 million or 36.2% to \$3.83 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$2.81 million as at 31 December 2021 due to the increase in trade and other payables, lease liabilities and bank borrowing repayable within the next 12 months. The trade

and other payables increased by \$0.66 million or 42.3% to \$2.21 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$1.56 million as at 31 December 2021 in line with the increase in purchases and expenses. The current lease liabilities increased by \$0.33 million or 66.0% to \$0.83 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$0.50 million as at 31 December 2021 due mainly to the additions of lease liabilities related to the new and renewed leases in FY22. The current bank borrowing increased by \$0.06 million or 11.6% to \$0.62 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$0.55 million as at 31 December 2021 due mainly to higher principal repayment within the next 12 months.

The non-current liabilities increased by \$1.16 million or 52.8% to \$3.36 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$2.20 million as at 31 December 2021 due mainly to the increase in lease liabilities, but moderated by the decrease in bank borrowing. The lease liabilities increased by \$1.77 million to \$1.98 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$0.21 million as at 31 December 2021 for the same reason mentioned above. The long-term bank borrowing reduced by \$0.62 million or 31.7% to \$1.33 million as at 31 December 2022 from \$1.95 million as at 31 December 2021 due to the repayments made in FY22.

Statement of cash flows

The net cash flows generated from operating activities of \$0.34 million was attributed mainly to the operating cash flows before changes in working capital of \$1.79 million and \$0.62 million increase in trade and other payables and contract liabilities, but moderated mainly by \$1.92 million increase in inventories.

The net cash used in investing activity of \$0.08 million was related mainly to the purchase of plant and equipment for new outlets.

The net cash used in financing activities of \$1.29 million was attributed mainly to the payment of principal portion of lease liabilities of \$0.63 million and bank borrowing of \$0.55 million.

These have resulted in a decrease in cash and cash equivalents of \$1.02 million in FY22.

The Group operates in a highly competitive industry with many competitors and low barriers to entry. The business is dependent heavily on the Government policies, general economic outlook, growth in consumer affluence in Singapore and Singapore tourism and hospitality industry.

Since the easing of Covid-19 safe management measures, the sales level has improved significantly but the headwinds from increasing operating costs and manpower challenges will have material financial impact on the earnings per share and net asset value per share of the Group for the financial year ending 31 December 2023.

It is the Group's intention to continue procuring whisky casks and bottling them for its own brands, and expand its foothold in the market organically or via joint ventures or strategic alliances with parties that can complement the Group's business.
