#### 1. General information

Koyo International Limited ("Company") is listed on the Catalist Board of Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited ("SGX-ST") and incorporated and domiciled in Singapore. These unaudited condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the six months ended 30 June 2023 comprise the financial statements of the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the "Group").

The principal activities of the Company are those of investment holding and business of providing integrated mechanical and electrical engineering ("M&E") services.

The principal activities of its subsidiaries are:

- (a) Providing integrated mechanical and electrical engineering services and facilities management services;
- (b) Engineering contract works;
- (c) Supply of essential construction materials, including but not limited to reclamation sand, construction sand, armour rock, granite and other aggregates;
- (d) Supply and installation of audio, video and security and communication systems;
- (e) Environmental engineering work;
- (f) General trading of products;
- (g) Building construction, air-conditioner, mechanical ventilation system installation and engineering works; and
- (h) Interior design services and renovation work.

### 2. Basis of preparation

The unaudited condensed interim financial statements for the six months ended 30 June 2023 have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The unaudited condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group since the last annual financial statements for the year 31 December 2022.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SRFS(I)s.

The unaudited condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore dollar which is the Company's functional currency.

### Going concern assumption

The Company incurred a net loss of S\$72,000 (31 December 2022: \$293,000) during the financial period ended 30 June 2023 and as at that date, the Company's current liabilities exceeds its current assets by S\$939,000 (31 December 2022: S\$807,000). Included in the current liabilities is an amount of S\$1,100,000 (31 December 2022: S\$1,000,000) due to a subsidiary.

Notwithstanding the above, the directors are of the view that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis as the subsidiary has undertaken not to seek immediate repayment of the amount due from the Company until the Company's external liabilities have been settled or when the Company's cashflows permit.

### 2.1 New and amended standards adopted by the Group

The Group has adopted all the new and revised SFRS(I) that are relevant to its operations and effective for the current financial period under review.

The adoption of these new/revised SFRS(I)s did not result in material changes to the Group's accounting policies and has no material effect on the financial results or position of the Group and the Company.

### 2.2 Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the unaudited condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that were applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the financial year ended 31 December 2022.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the financial period in which the estimates are revised and in any future financial periods affected.

### 3. Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period.

### 4. Segment and revenue information

The Group is organised into the following main business segments:

- Mechanical Engineering
- Electrical Engineering
- Facilities Management; and
- Investment Holding

These operating segments are reported in a manner consistent with internal reporting provided to the Board of Directors who are responsible for allocating resources and assessing performance of the operating segments. The Group's operations are mainly located in Singapore.

### 15. Subsequent events

- (i) On 14 July 2023, the Group's wholly owned subsidiary, Koyo Engineering (S.E. Asia) Pte. Ltd. has entered into a loan agreement with KF Capital Pte Ltd ("**KF Capital**"), an interested person for working capital loan of up to S\$3,500,000. As at the announcement date, the drawdown working capital loan amounted to S\$1,000,000. KF Capital. is controlled by Mdm Dalat Kositanon, who is the mother of Mr Foo Suay Wei and Mr Foo Suay Lun, the Managing Director and the Executive Director of the Group, respectively. Please refer to the Company's announcement dated 14 July 2023 for more details.
- (ii) On 19 July 2023, the Group announced that its customer Tiong Aik Construction Pte Ltd ("**Tiong Aik**"), has appointed provisional liquidators after having assessed that its financial condition is such that it is presently unable to pay its debts as and when they fall due. As at the date of this announcement, the Group has outstanding amounts due from Tiong Aik, including a sum of S\$1.26 million for work done and certified but unpaid by Tiong Aik, and Tiong Aik continues to hold a total retention sum of S\$0.98 million. Of the S\$1.26 million, approximately S\$0.8 million was recorded after 30 June 2023. For HY2023, the Group made an allowance for impairment of S\$453,000 from Tiong Aik relating invoices issued and unpaid as at 30 June 2023.

### 2. Review of the performance of the Group (cont'd)

The increase in total revenue in HY2023 is mainly attributable to the increase in revenue from the mechanical engineering segment. Revenue from the mechanical engineering segment increased mainly due to progression of ongoing projects. Revenue from the electrical engineering segment decreased due to slow progress claim certification from the main contractor. The revenue from the facilities management segment decreased as a result of projects completed in FY2022.

Gross profit decreased mainly attributable to a gross loss incurred from electrical engineering segment and a reduced in gross profit from facilities management segments, despite of the increase in gross profit generated from the mechanical engineering and gain on the fair value of investment securities

Gross profit margin decreased from 16.2% in HY2022 to 12.8% in HY2023 mainly due to an increase in the gross loss margin derived from electrical engineering segments. The gross loss margin from the electrical engineering segment was mainly due to higher cost for subcontractors' services, higher cost of employing foreign workers and higher material cost as well as slow certification of progress claim. In addition, the gross profit margin for mechanical engineering and facilities management segments had also decreased as a result of market inflation, causing an increase in cost of sales.

### iv) Other Income

Other income decreased mainly due to a decrease in the provision of government support grants such as foreign worker levy rebates in HY2023.

### v) Selling and distribution expenses

Selling and distribution expenses increased mainly due to the increase in freight and handling charges in HY2023.

### vi) Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses increased mainly due to an increase in rental of worker quarters as well as increase in rental pricing. In addition, there was an increased in staff cost as compared to HY2022 as the hiring of personnel was done after HY2022 for an increased operation of projects.

#### vii) Other operating expenses

Other operating expenses increased mainly due to an increase in allowance for impairment of trade receivables of \$453,000, increase in outsourced support services and repair & maintenance expenses.

### viii) Finance expenses

Finance expenses increased mainly due to an incurred interest from loan borrowings and trade finance interest.

### 3. Review of condensed interim statements of financial position

Total assets as at 30 June 2023 have decreased as compared to 31 December 2022, and are mainly attributable to the following:-

- **a. Property, plant and equipment ("PPE")** increased by 3.9%, mainly due to purchase of machineries and equipment and offset by depreciation expenses on PPE.
- **b. Investment securities at fair value through profit or loss** increased by 10.3% due to gain in fair values of the existing investment securities.
- **c. Trade and other receivables** decreased by 42.9% due to decrease in downpayment for subcontractors/suppliers and offset by increase in rental deposit to dormitories. Likewise, the trade receivables turnover days improved from 26 days to 11 days as at end of HY2023.
- **d.** Contract assets increased by 23.9% due to work completed but not yet billed as at 30 June 2023.
- **e.** Cash and bank balances decreased due to reasons as described in the cash flows analysis below.

Total liabilities as at 30 June 2023 have increased as compared to 31 December 2022, and are mainly attributable to the following:-

- a) **Trade and other payables** increased by 7.4% due to increase in purchases and services from subcontractors', which is in line with the increased revenue and include the unsecured loan from a Director
- b) **Contract liabilities** decreased as a result of reclassification of service performed to revenue.
- c) **Provisions** decreased as a result of cost incurred and reverse of the provisions during the period.
- d) **Lease liabilities (for current and non-current)** decreased due to the repayment of leases.
- e) **Bank borrowing** increased mainly due to disbursement of revolving term loan. Please refer to Note 12 for more information on the borrowings.

The Group's total equity stood at S\$15.2 million as at 30 June 2023 as compared to S\$18.0 million as at 31 December 2022.

#### 4. Review of condensed interim consolidated statement of cash flows

The Group had a negative operating cash flow before changes in working capital of S\$2.0 million. The increase in trade and other receivables and contract assets of S\$2.4 million, as well as a decrease in trade and other payables, contract liabilities and provision of S\$2.6 million, resulted in net cash used in operating activities of S\$7.0 million.

The net cash used in investing activities amounting to S\$0.6 million was mainly due to additions of property, plant and equipment for purchase of machineries and equipment.

The net cash generated from financing activities amounting to S\$5.1 million was mainly due to bank borrowing and loan from a director, further offset by the repayment of lease liabilities and net changes in trust receipts.

As at 30 June 2023, the Group had cash and cash equivalents of S\$5.2 million after excluding fixed deposits of S\$1.1 million pledged to banks for banking facilities.
