**680 underprivileged children in Malaysia to benefit from CapitaLand's
My Schoolbag programme**
***Signature annual CSR programme donates about RM170,000 in 2016, with
funding from CapitaLand Hope Foundation***

Kuala Lumpur, 9 December 2016 – CapitaLand Mall Asia, the region's leading shopping mall developer, owner and manager, and CapitaLand Malaysia Mall REIT Management Sdn. Bhd. (CMRM), the manager of CapitaLand Malaysia Mall Trust (CMMT), are pleased to announce that they are donating about RM170,000 to 680 underprivileged children in Malaysia under the sixth run of the "My Schoolbag" programme in the country this year. The donation is made possible with funding from CapitaLand Hope Foundation, the philanthropic arm of CapitaLand.

My Schoolbag is CapitaLand's key annual corporate social responsibility (CSR) programme, in which underprivileged children in the six countries where CapitaLand operates – Singapore, China, Malaysia, Japan, India and Vietnam – receive schoolbags containing school and daily necessities.

Under this year's My Schoolbag programme in Malaysia, 680 children from 21 charity homes and primary schools – six in Kuala Lumpur, eight in Selangor, one in Kuantan, five in Penang and one in Kedah – are visiting Sungei Wang Plaza in Kuala Lumpur; Tropicana City Mall in Petaling Jaya; The Mines in Seri Kembangan; Gurney Plaza and Queensbay Mall in Penang; and East Coast Mall in Kuantan, for a fun-filled half-day programme.

Over 170 staff volunteers will be accompanying the children as they take part in the activities arranged for them at the CapitaLand malls, such as Zumba workouts, exercise sessions, Lego and craft workshops. The children are also treated to lunch and each will be receiving school necessities including a new schoolbag, stationery, socks and shoes.

At the My Schoolbag programme at Sungei Wang Plaza today, 80 children from three charity homes in Kuala Lumpur were treated to a 20-minute martial arts self-defence dance performance at the centre court. The children also joined in the dance after picking up some moves from the instructors. After the energetic dance performance, the children took part in Lego workshops, followed by a delicious lunch treat. After spending an enjoyable time at the shopping mall, the children went back home with their new schoolbags filled with school necessities, ready for the new school year.

Ms Low Peck Chen, Chief Executive Officer of CMRM, said: "For this year's My Schoolbag programme in Malaysia, we have specially designed activities that help the children to foster team

spirit, boost self-confidence and enhance social skills. As our malls are an integral part of the communities, we are glad to be able to do our part to reach out to the communities we serve.”

“Since My Schoolbag was introduced in Malaysia in 2011, it has benefited about 3,800 underprivileged children with a total donation of more than RM900,000. We would like to thank our staff volunteers, partners and retailers for their support and commitment in working with us to bring My Schoolbag programme to the community.”
