#### Restatement of comparatives

#### (i) Acquisition of Silverlake Investment Ltd. and its subsidiaries

On 20 October 2017, the Company entered into a share sale and purchase agreement with Group Executive Chairman, Mr. Goh Peng Ooi and other minority shareholders to acquire the entire issued share capital of Silverlake Investment Ltd. and its subsidiaries ("SIL Group"). The SIL Group comprising wholly-owned subsidiaries, Silverlake Digital Economy Sdn. Bhd. ("SDE"), Silverlake Digitale Sdn. Bhd. ("SDS") and Silverlake One Paradigm Sdn. Bhd. ("SOP") variously provide the front and middle layers to enhance the Company's digital capabilities. These layers are connected into core banking systems to deliver customer digital engagement and digital experience capabilities.

The acquisition was completed on 18 April 2018 and SIL Group became a subsidiary of the Company. As this acquisition is a combination of entities under common control whereby the Company and SIL Group are under the common control of a major shareholder, the Group's financial statements have been prepared based on the pooling of interest method of accounting. Accordingly, the comparative figures for the Group's financial statements have been presented as if the Group structure immediately after the acquisition had been in existence since the earliest financial year presented.

Hence, the amounts presented as amount due from/(to) customers for contract work-in-progress, advance maintenance costs/fees and prepaid costs/deferred revenue are now reclassified and presented as contract assets and contract liabilities respectively in compliance with the standard.

#### (ii) IFRS 9 Financial Instruments

IFRS 9 introduces new requirements for classification and measurement of financial assets, impairment of financial assets and hedge accounting effective for annual period beginning on or after 1 January 2018. Financial assets are classified according to their contractual cash flow characteristics and the business model under which they are held. The new impairment model under IFRS 9 requires the recognition of impairment based on expected credit losses, replaced the incurred credit loss model under IAS 39.

The Group adopted IFRS 9 effective 1 July 2018 without restating prior periods' information and any difference between the previous carrying amount and the carrying amount at the date of initial application shall be adjusted in the opening retained profits. Based on the historical credit loss experience as well as assessment undertaken on financial assets classified at amortised cost, loans and receivables, no additional impairment loss adjustments being made to the opening retained profits. The classification and measurement of the Group's financial assets are appropriate.

# (a)(i) INCOME STATEMENT REVIEW – Second quarter ended 31 December 2018 ("Q2 FY2019") vs Second quarter ended 31 December 2017 ("Q2 FY2018")

#### **Overview**

Silverlake Axis Ltd (SAL) provides technology and digital economy solutions to the Banking, Insurance, Payments, Retail and Logistics industries. Founded in 1989, SAL has built an impeccable track record of successful core banking implementations. The Group's Software and Services Solutions deliver operational excellence and enable business transformations at over 300 organisations across Asia Pacific, Africa, Central Europe and Middle East.

From FY2011 to FY2018, the Group has successfully undertaken six acquisitions to broaden the suite of business enterprise software solutions and services offerings and strengthen its market position in new markets in New Zealand, Australia, South Asia and Europe. With expanded capabilities, the Group is well positioned to empower its customers to compete effectively in the digital economy ecosystem. Buoyed by continual investments in Information Technology ("IT") by Asian financial institutions and corporations to improve their competitive edge, the Group continues to achieve steady growth in market share.

In Q2 FY2019, the Group achieved a revenue increase of 20% compared with the previous corresponding period and recorded a net profit attributable to shareholders of RM67.5 million, 99% higher than the RM34.0 million for Q2 FY2018.

Q2 FY2019 group revenue of RM169.0 million was 20% higher compared with Q2 FY2018. The contribution from project related revenue segments increased and the recurrent revenue segments comprising maintenance and enhancement services as well as provision of Software-as-a-Service for the insurance industry, making up approximately 75% of Group revenue for the period, continued to grow at 16% and 3% respectively.

Project related revenue comprising software licensing and software project services totalling RM38.7 million in Q2 FY2019 was 55% higher compared with RM25.0 million recorded in the previous corresponding period. Software licensing revenue increased from RM10.0 million in Q2 FY2018 to RM19.7 million in Q2 FY2019 mainly due to the delivery of new larger core banking contracts in Malaysia and new retail automation contracts in Vietnam and Hong Kong in Q2 FY2019 as compared with the recognition of progressive revenue in Q2 FY2018 from a few ongoing implementation contracts in Thailand and Brunei.

Revenue from software project services also recorded a 26% growth to RM19.0 million in Q2 FY2019 compared with RM15.0 million in Q2 FY2018. The increase was mainly due to higher revenue achieved in Q2 FY2019 from the progressive delivery of two new higher value Malaysian projects secured in late FY2018 and new implementation projects secured from the retail industry in Hong Kong as compared with the progressive revenue contribution from the ongoing Thailand projects in both Q2 FY2018 and Q2 FY2019.

Revenue from maintenance and enhancement services improved from RM102.7 million in Q2 FY2018 to RM118.9 million in Q2 FY2019 mainly due to new enhancement contracts secured during the quarter to support the digital banking and payments transformation initiatives of two established financial institutions in Singapore.

Following the termination of outsourcing contract by a major customer, revenue contribution from credit and cards processing decreased by 44% from RM4.8 million in Q2 FY2018 to RM2.7 million in Q2 FY2019. The decrease was partially offset by higher revenue from an existing customer with a new tier-pricing fee arrangement signed since Q3 FY2018.

#### **Profitability**

Due to the improvement in revenue, the Group recorded a gross profit of RM108.1 million in Q2 FY2019, 32% higher compared with RM81.9 million in Q2 FY2018. The Group's gross profit margin of 64% in Q2 FY2019 was higher compared with 58% in Q2 FY2018 mainly due to a change in revenue mix with a higher proportion of revenue recorded from higher margin software licensing segment and software project services in Q2 FY2019 as compared with the previous corresponding period.

Other income was markedly higher in Q2 FY2019 compared with Q2 FY2018 mainly due to the recognition of a pre-tax gain of RM8.8 million from disposal of freehold land and higher realised foreign currency exchange gain from translation of bank balances denominated in foreign currencies in Q2 FY2019.

Selling and distribution expenses decreased by 38% from RM11.1 million to RM7.0 million in Q2 FY2019, reflecting lower marketing and business development activities in Q2 FY2019.

Compared with Q2 FY2018, administrative expenses decreased by 12% from RM30.2 million to RM26.6 million in Q2 FY2019 mainly due to lower professional fees incurred for acquisitions in Q2 FY2019, lower charge on share awards granted pursuant to Silverlake Axis Ltd. Performance Share Plan ("PSP") in Q2 FY2019 as well as lower unrealised foreign currency exchange loss recorded from smaller fluctuation of bank balances denominated in foreign currencies in Q2 FY2019.

The significant increase in finance costs from RM0.4 million in Q2 FY2018 to RM6.5 million in Q2 FY2019 was mainly due to the quarterly fair value adjustment on the contingent consideration payable for the acquisition of SIL Group as required by IFRS.

With higher revenue, higher other income and lower operating expenses, partially offset by higher finance costs, the Group recorded a profit before tax of RM80.6 million in Q2 FY2019 compared with RM41.2 million in Q2 FY2018.

Income tax expense increased from RM7.2 million in Q2 FY2018 to RM13.0 million in Q2 FY2019 mainly due to higher taxable income from certain subsidiaries and the expiry of pioneer status of two Malaysian subsidiaries.

The Group reported a growth of 99% in profit after tax attributable to shareholders to RM67.5 million in Q2 FY2019 from RM34.0 million recorded in Q2 FY2018 and achieved a net profit margin of 40% in Q2 FY2019, 16% higher compared with the 24% achieved in Q2 FY2018.

# (a)(ii) INCOME STATEMENT REVIEW – Half year period ended 31 December 2018 ("1H FY2019") vs Half year period ended 31 December 2017 ("1H FY2018")

#### **Overview**

In 1H FY2019, group revenue increased by 28% compared with the previous corresponding financial period and the Group recorded a net profit attributable to shareholders of RM125.5 million, 84% higher than the RM68.1 million achieved in 1H FY2018.

For 1H FY2019, the Group achieved a revenue of RM336.2 million, 28% higher compared with RM263.1 million recorded in 1H FY2018. The key business segments comprising project related and recurrent revenue segments contributed higher revenue in 1H FY2019.

Project related revenue comprising software licensing and software project services recorded significant growth to RM93.7 million in 1H FY2019 from RM40.5 million in 1H FY2018. Revenue from software licensing rose significantly to RM45.2 million in 1H FY2019 mainly due to the delivery of new larger core banking contracts in Malaysia, new retail automation contracts in Vietnam and Hong Kong as well as higher progressive revenue recognised from the delivery of ongoing contracts in Thailand and Sri Lanka in 1H FY2019 as compared with 1H FY2018.

Software project services revenue of RM48.5 million in 1H FY2019 was 83% higher as compared with the previous corresponding period as there was higher progressive revenue recognised from two new Malaysian core banking projects secured in late FY2018, new Hong Kong retail based projects secured in 1H FY2019 and a few ongoing implementation contracts secured in Thailand, Malaysia, Sri Lanka and Singapore. Further revenue recognition from project related revenue segments are expected to take place in the subsequent quarters with the progressive delivery of ongoing and new software licensing and implementation contracts secured in late FY2018 and 1H FY2019.

Revenue from maintenance and enhancement services increased by 10% from RM197.2 million in 1H FY2018 to RM217.6 million in 1H FY2019 mainly due to a few new enhancement contracts secured in 1H FY2019 in response to the requests for support in the digital banking and payments transformation initiatives by two established financial institutions in Singapore in addition to revenue contribution from ongoing regulatory compliance related enhancement contracts delivered for Malaysian financial institutions.

The decrease in credit and cards processing revenue by 12% from RM9.1 million in 1H FY2018 to RM8.0 million in 1H FY2019 was mainly due to the termination of outsourcing contract by a major customer effective Q2 FY2019, partially offset by higher processing revenue from an existing customer with a new tier-pricing fee arrangement signed since Q3 FY2018.

Following the expansion of business activities into Thailand, Hong Kong and Vietnam as well as new customers secured in Malaysia, Indonesia and Philippines, revenue from Software-as-a-Service for insurance processing was 7% higher in 1H FY2019 compared with 1H FY2018.

#### <u>Profitability</u>

The Group recorded a gross profit of RM213.0 million in 1H FY2019, 47% higher than the RM145.3 million recorded in 1H FY2018 and achieved 63% gross profit margin in 1H FY2019 as compared with 55% for 1H FY2018. The improvement was due to a change in revenue mix with higher proportion of revenue recorded from higher margin software licensing segment and software project services in 1H FY2019 as compared with 1H FY2018.

Lower finance income was recorded in 1H FY2019 due to lower deposits placed with financial institutions in 1H FY2019 compared with 1H FY2018.

Other income increased significantly to RM12.4 million in 1H FY2019 from RM4.5 million in 1H FY2018 as there was a pre-tax gain of RM8.8 million in 1H FY2019 from the disposal of freehold land, partially offset by the waiver of debts of RM1.1 million recorded in 1H FY2018.

Selling and distribution expenses of RM16.4 million in 1H FY2019 were 7% lower compared with RM17.6 million in 1H FY2018, reflecting lower marketing and business development activities in 1H FY2019.

Administrative expenses decreased by 10% from RM53.6 million in 1H FY2018 to RM48.0 million in 1H FY2019 due to lower professional fees incurred for the acquisitions in 1H FY2019 and lower charge on share awards granted pursuant to PSP in 1H FY2019.

Finance costs increased significantly to RM12.7 million in 1H FY2019 from RM0.9 million in 1H FY2018 mainly due to the quarterly fair value adjustment on the contingent consideration payable for the acquisition of SIL Group as required by IFRS.

With higher revenue and other income coupled with lower operating expenses, partially offset by higher finance costs, the Group recorded a profit before tax of RM148.0 million in 1H FY2019 compared with RM79.3 million in 1H FY2018, a growth of 87%.

Income tax expense of RM22.6 million in 1H FY2019 was significantly higher compared with RM11.2 million in 1H FY2018 and the effective tax rate of 15% in 1H FY2019 was 1% higher than the 14% reported in 1H FY2018. Higher tax expense recorded in 1H FY2019 mainly due to the expiry of pioneer status of two Malaysian subsidiaries in addition to higher taxable income from certain subsidiaries and increase in withholding tax on overseas revenue.

The Group reported 84% higher profit after tax attributable to shareholders of RM125.5 million in 1H FY2019 compared with RM68.1 million in 1H FY2018 and achieved net profit margin of 37% in 1H FY2019, 11% higher than the 26% achieved in 1H FY2018.

#### (b) STATEMENTS OF FINANCIAL POSITION REVIEW

## Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment ("PPE") decreased from RM20.4 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM14.1 million as at 31 December 2018 mainly due to the disposal of freehold land in Q2 FY2019 and the depreciation charge for the quarter. The decrease was partially offset by office renovation cost capitalised and purchase of office equipment during 1H FY2019 as well as higher foreign currency translation on PPE attributable to the appreciation of United States Dollar ("USD") and Singapore Dollar ("SGD") against Ringgit Malaysia ("RM") in Q2 FY2019 compared with Q4 FY2018.

## Intangible assets

The increase in intangible assets from RM206.7 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM212.4 million as at 31 December 2018 was mainly due to the capitalisation of software development expenditure incurred for the development of enhanced core banking and Fintech solutions during 1H FY2019 as well as higher foreign currency translation on intangibles attributable to the appreciation of USD and SGD against RM in Q2 FY2019 compared with Q4 FY2018. The increase was partially offset by the amortisation of intangible assets in 1H FY2019.

### Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables increased from RM138.7 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM148.5 million as at 31 December 2018 as the remaining RM14.9 million sale proceed from the disposal of freehold land will only be settled, when the conditions precedent are satisfied, within the stipulated sale completion period. This increase was partially offset with collection from customers during 1H FY2019.

#### Contract assets/(liabilities)

The net contract liabilities decreased from RM43.0 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM39.7 million as at 31 December 2018. The components of contract assets and contract liabilities are presented as follows:

- (iii) Deferred revenue as at 31 December 2018 was RM8.6 million compared with RM2.2 million as at 30 June 2018 mainly due to the requirement of IFRS 15 where maintenance contracts which contain free man-days are required to be accounted for as separate performance obligations ("PO") and revenue to be allocated to each PO accordingly. A portion of the advance maintenance fees recognised as of 30 June 2018 have been reallocated to these unutilised free man-days. The revenue allocated to the free man-days and options for the customers to acquire additional goods or services at discounts will be deferred until they are either utilised, exercised, expired or lapsed, and presented as contract liabilities when the consideration is received.

### Amounts due from/(to) related parties

The amounts due from/(to) related parties are transactions between the Group and Interested Persons ("Silverlake Entities") under the approved General Mandate for Interested Person Transactions and the Ancillary Transactions Mandate (collectively "Mandates"). These amounts fluctuate from quarter to quarter mainly due to the timing of billings and payments received.

# Financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income - quoted equity shares

This financial asset represents the retained equity interest in Global InfoTech Co. Ltd. ("GIT"). The 37.1 million shares were valued at RM189.8 million as at 30 June 2018 and re-measured at RM134.3 million as at 31 December 2018, with RM60.3 million unrealised fair value loss recognised in Other Comprehensive Income.

## Cash and bank balances

Cash and bank balances increased from RM304.0 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM378.2 million as at 31 December 2018 mainly due to net cash inflow from operating activities of RM152.5 million, partially offset by cash outflow from financing activities of RM88.3 million for payment of dividends to shareholders.

#### Total current and non-current trade and other payables

Current trade and other payables increased from RM65.8 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM71.5 million as at 31 December 2018 mainly due to higher accruals of sub-contractors' fees.

The non-current other payable represents the fair value of contingent consideration payable to the vendors in FY2021 in relation to the acquisition of the entire share capital of SIL Group. The non-current other payable increased from RM233.7 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM245.9 million as at 31 December 2018 after taking into account the effect of time value of money and the discounting effect is recognised as Finance Costs in 1H FY2019.

#### Deferred tax

The decrease in deferred tax from a net liability position of RM15.5 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM11.4 million as at 31 December 2018 was mainly due to the reversal of withholding tax provided for financial assets attributable to the changes in fair value of GIT shares quoted on ChiNext of the Shenzhen Stock Exchange. The deferred tax relating to fair value loss on financial assets of RM6.0 million was recognised in Other Comprehensive Income.

# Total current and non-current loans and borrowings

Loans and borrowings increased from RM28.3 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM44.8 million as at 31 December 2018 mainly due to drawdown of revolving credit and the utilisation of bank overdraft facility by a subsidiary for working capital purposes.

#### Amount due to holding company

The amount due to holding company, Intelligentsia Holding Ltd., represents advances given to SIL Group prior to the acquisition of SIL Group. This balance had been fully settled in 1H FY2019.

#### **Current income tax**

Current income tax assets and liabilities represent the amount expected to be recovered from or paid to the taxation authorities. The increase in net tax payable from RM8.9 million as at 30 June 2018 to RM16.9 million as at 31 December 2018 was mainly due to higher taxable income from certain subsidiaries and the expiry of pioneer status of two Malaysian subsidiaries.

Following the recent expansion of the Group's suite of digital banking solutions, the Group is actively cross selling these capabilities to existing customers to strengthen relationships and broaden the Group's revenue base. The Group is constantly evaluating suitable companies for acquisition to further expand its portfolio of Fintech and Insurtech software products and services to better serve its customers.
