Notes to the condensed interim consolidated financial statements

1 Corporate information

The Company is incorporated as a limited liability company and domiciled in Singapore and is listed on the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited (SGX-ST). These condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the 18-month period ended 30 June 2025 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the "Group").

The principal activity of the Company is investment holding. The principal activities of the subsidiaries are the provision of transportation management, logistics services and airport cargo terminal handling.

2 Basis of preparation

SGX Appendix 7.2 para 4

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements for the 18-month period ended 30 June 2025 have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim consolidated financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to understand changes in the Group's financial positions and performance of the Group since the last annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2023.

The accounting policies and method of computation adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1.

The condensed interim consolidated financial statements are presented in Singapore Dollar which is the Company's functional currency.

2.1 New and amended standards

SGX Appendix 7.2 para 5

There has been no change in the accounting policies and methods of computation adopted by the Group for the current reporting period compared with the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2023, except for the adoption of new or revised SFRS(I) and Interpretations of SFRS (I) ("INT SFRS (I)") that are mandatory for the financial year beginning on or after 1 January 2024. The adoption of these SFRS (I) and INT SFRS (I) has no significant impact on the Group.

2.2 Use of judgement and estimates

In preparing the condensed financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. Actual result may differ from these estimates. The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that were applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the financial year ended 31 December 2023. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

Information about critical judgements in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements is included in the following notes:

- (a) Determination of the lease term of right-of-use assets
- (b) Income tax

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of each reporting period are discussed below:

- (a) Depreciation of plant and equipment and right-of-use assets
- (b) Estimation of the incremental borrowing rate ("IBR")
- (c) Provision of expected credit losses of trade and other receivables

Notes to the condensed interim consolidated financial statements (Cont'd)

2.2 Use of judgement and estimates (Cont'd)

Judgements made in applying accounting policies

(a) Determination of the lease term of right-of-use assets

The Group leases leasehold buildings, transport equipment and office equipment from third parties to operate its business. In determining the lease term of these leases, management considers all facts and circumstances that create an economic incentive to exercise an extension option, or not to exercise a termination option. Extension options (or period after termination options) are only included in the lease term if the lease is reasonably certain to be extended (or not terminated). The lease term is reassessed if an option is actually exercised (or not exercise) or the Group becomes obliged to exercise (or not exercise) it. The assessment of reasonable certainty is only revised if a significant event or a significant change in circumstances occurs, which affects the assessment, and that is within the control of the lessee.

For leases of leasehold buildings and transport equipment, the following factors are normally the most relevant:

- (i) If there are significant penalties to terminate (or not extend), the Group is typically reasonably certain to extend (or not terminate);
- If the leasehold improvements are expected to have a significant remaining value, the Group is typically reasonably certain to extend (or in not to terminate);
- (iii) Otherwise, the Group considers other factors including historical lease durations and the costs and business disruption required to replace the leased asset.

(b) Income tax

The Group has exposures to income taxes in Singapore. Significant judgment is involved in determining the group-wide provision for income taxes. There are certain transactions and computations for which the ultimate tax determination is uncertain during the ordinary course of business. The Group recognises liabilities for expected tax issue based on estimates of whether additional taxes will be due. Where the final tax outcome of these matters is different from the amounts that were initially recognised, such differences will impact the income tax and deferred tax provisions in the period in which such determination is made.

Notes to the condensed interim consolidated financial statements (Cont'd)

2.2 Use of judgement and estimates (Cont'd)

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

(a) Depreciation of plant and equipment and right-of-use assets

The cost of plant and equipment and right-of-use assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over their estimated useful lives.

Management reviews annually the estimated useful lives of plant and equipment and right-of-use assets, based on factors that include asset utilisation, internal technical evaluation, technological changes and anticipated use of the assets. It is possible that future results of operations could be materially affected by changes in these estimates brought about by changes in the factors mentioned.

A reduction in the estimated useful lives of these non-financial assets would increase depreciation expense and decrease non-current assets.

(b) Estimation of the incremental borrowing rate ("IBR")

For the purpose of calculating the right-of-use asset and lease liability, management applies the interest rate implicit in the lease ("IRIIL") and, if the IRIIL is not readily determinable, management will use the IBR applicable to the lease asset. The IBR is the rate of interest that the entity would have to pay to borrow over a similar term, and with a similar security, the funds necessary to obtain an asset of a similar value to the right-of-use asset in a similar economic environment. For most of the leases where the Company is the lessee, the IRIIL is not readily determinable.

Therefore, management estimates the IBR relevant to each lease asset by using observable inputs (such as market interest rate and asset yield) when available, and then making certain lessee specific adjustments.

(c) Provision of expected credit losses of trade and other receivables

The Group uses a provision matrix to calculate expected credit losses (ECLs) for trade receivables. The provision rates are determined based on the Group's historical observed default rates analysed in accordance to days past due. The Group will calibrate the matric to adjust for historical credit loss experience with forward-looking information.

The Group's and the Company's credit risk exposure on other receivables are based on qualitative and quantitative factors that are indicative of risk of default (including but not limited to external ratings, audited financial statements, management accounts, cashflow projections and available press information).

The assessment of the correlation between historical observed default rates, forecast economic conditions and ECLs is a significant estimate. The amount of ECLs is sensitive to changes in circumstances and forecast of economic conditions. The Group's historical credit loss experience and forecast of economic conditions may also not be representative of customer's actual default in the future.

3 Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period.

Group Income Review

Six Months Ended 30 June 2025 vs 30 June 2024

The Group's revenue of S\$16.40 million, an 9% increase from S\$15.10 million in the prior period. The improvement was driven by higher volume in sea freight forwarding, transportation, warehousing, and supply chain services, partly offset by reduced FCL activity.

Other income declined to S\$0.64 million from S\$0.75 million, mainly due to lower interest income from fixed deposits and fewer third-party IT services. No government grants were received during the period.

Total operating expenses slightly decreased to \$\$16.05 million (2024: \$\$16.16 million). Service costs increased to \$\$5.06 million due to higher subcontractor expenses, while salaries and employee benefits declined to \$\$6.87 million, reflecting headcount reductions and bonus reversals. Depreciation remained stable at \$\$3.06 million, with marginal increases from new EV additions. Finance costs decreased to \$\$0.30 million, in line with reduced lease obligations. Other operating expenses declined to \$\$0.76 million, largely from lower consultancy costs, although partially offset by IT subscriptions, payroll system implementation, and a corporate donation.

The Group returned to profitability, with S\$0.99 million recorded before tax. Net profit after tax came in at S\$0.82 million, compared to a net loss of S\$0.41 million in the prior period. No discontinued operations were recorded in either period. Total comprehensive income stood at S\$0.82 million versus a loss of S\$0.41 million in the prior period.

18 Months Ended 30 June 2025 vs 12 Months Ended 31 December 2023

Note: The current period covers 18 months (1 January 2024 to 30 June 2025), while the prior period covers 12 months (1 January to 31 December 2023). As such, all comparisons below are directional and not directly comparable on an annual basis. Annualised commentary is provided where relevant to better reflect underlying trends.

The Group recorded revenue of S\$47.47 million for the 18-month period, a 55% increase from S\$30.56 million in the previous 12 months. This improvement was driven by expanded activity across sea freight forwarding, transportation, warehousing, and supply chain services throughout 2024 and early 2025.

Other income rose to S\$2.38 million, up from S\$1.46 million (163%), mainly due to higher third-party IT services and government grants received. This was partially offset by lower interest income from fixed deposits and reduced gains from asset disposals. The increase reflects a combination of improved ancillary income streams and a longer reporting window.

Service costs and related expenses increased to S\$14.61 million, compared to S\$9.82 million in the 12-month period. While the figure appears higher in absolute terms, the annualised cost of S\$9.74 million actually reflects a marginal reduction. This decline is attributed to improved subcontractor cost controls and lower diesel prices in 2H 2024 and 1H 2025.

Salaries and employee benefits amounted to S\$21.78 million (vs S\$14.68 million), but the annualised amount of S\$14.52 million shows a slight decrease. This reflects the Group's cost optimisation efforts, including headcount management and more disciplined bonus provisioning, despite a higher average workforce during the period.

Depreciation and amortisation nearly doubled to S\$9.15 million from S\$4.90 million, due primarily to lease renewals in late 2024 and new right-of-use assets added in 1H 2025. The increase is expected and time-based, consistent with lease accounting standards, and not indicative of an accelerated capital expenditure trend.

Finance costs rose sharply to S\$1.05 million, from S\$0.25 million previously. This increase is largely due to higher lease liabilities linked to renewed and expanded warehouse leases. The rise reflects the longer duration of reporting and structural growth in leased asset usage.

Other operating expenses rose to S\$2.58 million, compared to S\$1.89 million previously. On an annualised basis, however, these costs equate to S\$1.72 million, reflecting

tighter control over administrative, consultancy, and discretionary spending.

As a result of these movements, total operating expenses increased to \$\$49.16 million, from \$\$31.54 million. This reflects the extended period but also aligns with higher business volume and scale. Importantly, the monthly cost run rate remained stable, pointing to cost efficiency gains.

Despite the longer period and higher activity, the Group generated a profit before tax of S\$0.68 million, up from S\$0.48 million in the prior 12-month period (+41%). After taxation of S\$0.58 million, net profit came in at S\$0.10 million, slightly above the S\$0.08 million recorded in FY2023.

There were no discontinued operations in the current period. In comparison, the prior period included a net gain of S\$0.03 million from the disposal of the Group's Indonesian logistics business.

Total comprehensive income for the 18-month period was S\$0.10 million, down from S\$0.13 million. No other comprehensive income items (e.g. FX or actuarial movements) were recorded during the current period.

Group Balance Sheet Review

Current assets increased by S\$2.39 million to S\$25.61 million as at 30 June 2025, driven mainly by a S\$1.68 million increase in cash and cash equivalents, supported by positive operating cash flow and proceeds from the exercise of warrants. Trade receivables also rose by S\$0.76 million, consistent with higher sales activity and period-end billing. These increases were partially offset by marginal reductions in other receivables and prepaid operating expenses, due to timing differences in advance payments and recoverables

Non-current assets grew by \$\$3.58 million to \$\$11.84 million, primarily due to a \$\$3.95 million increase in right-of-use assets following lease renewals and the recognition of new lease arrangements for operational facilities. This increase was partly offset by depreciation and amortisation over the reporting period.

Current liabilities increased by S\$3.53 million to S\$10.69 million, largely reflecting a rise in current lease liabilities from reclassification of maturing obligations and new leases. Trade payables and income tax payable saw minor decreases, while other payables rose due to the timing of accrued costs and settlements.

Non-current liabilities increased by S\$0.71 million to S\$4.91 million, mainly due to higher non-current lease liabilities and adjustments to deferred tax liabilities in line with lease asset movements.

As a result, net assets rose to S\$21.84 million, up from S\$20.11 million, reflecting profit accumulation over the 18-month period and a higher share capital base following the exercise of warrants.

The Group continues to apply the expected credit loss (ECL) model to assess trade and other receivables. Based on active credit monitoring and strong historical collection performance, no material impairment losses were recognised.

Group Cashflow Statement Review

For the 18-month period ended 30 June 2025, the Group recorded a net cash generated from operating activities of \$\$9.71 million, more than double the \$\$4.69 million reported for the 12-month period ended 31 December 2023. This improvement was mainly driven by higher operating profit before working capital changes and lower payments for income tax and other payables.

Net cash generated from investing activities amounted to \$\$1.76 million, slightly lower than the \$\$2.28 million in the prior year. The decline was due to lower proceeds from the disposal of plant and equipment and increased capital expenditure on plant, right-of-use, and intangible assets. However, this was offset by a consistent \$\$2.5 million withdrawal from fixed deposits in both periods.

Net cash used in financing activities rose to S\$7.29 million from S\$5.82 million, largely due to higher lease liability repayments and increased finance costs, partially offset by proceeds from exercise of warrants.

As a result, the Group's cash and cash equivalents increased by \$\\$4.18 million, compared to \$\\$1.15 million in the previous 12-month period. The Group ended the period with a strong cash balance of \$\\$9.55 million, up from \$\\$5.37 million, reflecting enhanced liquidity through improved cash generation and resource allocation.
