E. Notes to the condensed consolidated financial statements

1. Corporate information

Sakae Holdings Ltd. (the "Company") is incorporated and domiciled in Singapore. Its shares are publicly traded on the Mainboard of the Singapore Exchange. These condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the twelve months ended 30 June 2025 are for the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the "Group").

The principal activities of the Company consist of the business of operating restaurants, trading of raw food materials, food processing and operating as caterer and event organiser.

The principal activities of the Group consist of the business of investment holding, operating restaurants, kiosks and cafes, provision of corporate advisory services, provision of cold storage warehousing and logistics services.

2. Basis of preparation

The condensed financial statements for the twelve months ended 30 June 2025 have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore ("Standards"). The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the last audited annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2024.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore dollars, which is the Company's functional currency.

2.1 New and amended standards adopted by the Group

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year except that in the current financial year, the Group has adopted all the new and amended standards which are relevant to the Group and are effective for annual financial periods beginning on or after 1 July 2024. The adoption of these standards did not have any material effect on the financial performance or position of the Group.

2.2 Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty are the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2024.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which estimates are revised and in any future period affected.

3. Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025 ("FY2025").

F. Other Information required by Listing Rule Appendix 7.2

1. Review

The condensed consolidated statement of financial position of Sakae Holdings Ltd and its subsidiaries as at 30 June 2025, the related condensed profit or loss and other comprehensive income, condensed consolidated statements of changes in equity, condensed consolidated statement of cash flows for the six months period and twelve months then ended, and, certain explanatory notes have not been audited or reviewed.

2. Review of performance of the Group

Financial performance (2HFY2025 vs 2HFY2024)

Group revenue for the half-year ended 30 June 2025 ("2HFY2025") totalled \$5.4 million, a decrease of 22.1% as compared to \$7 million in the corresponding period of the previous year ("2HFY2024"). The operating environment in the food and beverage industry remained challenging, as high inflationary costs led to escalating operating costs in food, manpower and utilities, amidst conservative consumer spending sentiments. During the period, some leases that had expired were not renewed, resulting in store closures hence contributing to the reduced Group revenue. The Group will continue to seek improvements in its operational efficiency while broadening its product offerings to various clientele in its efforts to grow and expand its business, both in Business-to-Consumer (B2C) and Business-to-Business (B2B) segments.

Aside from continuing to build its food trading business to boost revenue and profit, the Group will look at other avenues of bringing revenue to the Group, leveraging on its distribution networks and brand identity. The Group will continue to manage the use of raw materials for its restaurant business effectively, and expand procurement of raw materials from producer sources in line with its farm-to-table approach.

The gross profit margin has declined marginally from 60.3% in 2HFY2024 to 59.5% in 2HFY2025. Efforts are ongoing to review and manage the inflationary costs of raw materials through effective pricing strategies and ongoing food cost management.

Other operating income and gains has decreased by \$0.7 million from \$2.9 million in 2HFY2024 to \$2.2 million in 2HFY2025. There was a one-off fee recovery in 2HFY2024, as well as, income from invoice adjustments.

Administrative expenses decreased by 7.7%, from \$6.6 million in 2HFY2024 to \$6.1 million in 2HFY2025, due to associated costs savings from store closures as well as improved operational efficiency.

Other operating expenses has decreased by \$0.3 million, from \$1.7 million in 2HY2024 to \$1.4 million in 2HFY2025, due to lower rental and utilities associated with the closure of outlets.

Finance costs decreased from \$0.9 million in 2HFY2024 to \$0.7 million in 2HFY2025, mainly due to lower interest rates during the period, resulting in lower borrowing costs.

Group loss before tax and net loss after tax for 2HFY2025 are recorded at \$2.8 million and \$2.9 million respectively, which represented an increase of \$0.7 million and \$0.5 million as compared to Group loss before tax and net loss after tax for 2HFY2024 of \$2.1 million and \$2.4 million respectively. The Group's net loss is attributed largely to the depreciation of its building in Singapore and interest totalling \$1.4 million. The Group will continue to use the building and its resources efficiently and effectively to support the Group's operations

Financial performance (FY2025 vs FY2024)

Group revenue for the twelve months ended 30 June 2025 ("FY2025") totalled \$12.3 million, a decrease of 14.7% as compared with \$14.4 million in the corresponding period of the previous year ("FY2024"). The Food & Beverage sector continues operating in a challenging inflationary environment, now exacerbated by global conservative consumer sentiment. The disruption in restaurant operations due to the relocation and

renovation of stores as obligated by leasing requirements contributed to the decrease. The Group will monitor evolving consumer trends and shifting demand patterns, in order to remain resilent and competitive.

The gross profit margin has declined marginally from 63.9% in FY2024 to 61.8% in FY2025, due to the ongoing inflationary trend in raw material costs. The Group will continue to manage the inflationary raw materials costs through effective pricing strateigies and ongoing food cost management.

Other operating income and gains has decreased by \$0.7 million from \$5.1 million in FY2024 to \$4.4 million due to a one-off fee recovery, as well as income from invoice adjustments.

Administrative expenses decreased by 5.4%, from \$12.6 million in FY2024 to \$11.9 million in FY2025, due to improved operational efficiency and other reduction in costs associated with store closures.

Other operating expenses decreased by 14.8%, from \$3 million in FY2024 to \$2.5 million in FY2025, due to lower rental and utilities associated with the closure of outlets.

Finance costs decreased from \$1.7 million in FY2024 to \$1.4 million in FY2025, largely due to lower interest rates during the period, resulting in lower borrowing costs.

Group loss before tax and net loss after tax are recorded at \$4 million respectively in FY2025, which represented an increase of \$1.1 million and \$0.7 million, as compared to Group loss before tax and net loss after tax of \$2.9 million and \$3.3 million in FY2024.

The Group's net loss for the period is is attributed largely to the depreciation of its building in Singapore and interest totalling \$2.9 million.

Financial position of the Group

The Group and Company cash and bank balances as at 30 June 2025 ("FY2025") stood at \$1.5 million and \$0.4 million, compared to \$3.8 million and \$1.2 million in FY2024. The Group will continue to be cautious and will take reasonable steps to manage its cash flow effectively.

Trade receivables remain the same at \$1.2 million in FY2024 as compared to FY2025.

Other receivables and prepayments remain the same at \$0.6 million in FY2024 as compared to FY2025.

Inventory decreased by \$0.1 million from \$0.4 million in FY2024 to \$0.3 million in FY2025, with a re-balancing of stockholding requirements with demand and timeliness of supply.

Trade payables decreased by \$0.3 million from \$1.4 million in FY2024 to \$1.1 million in FY2025 with trade financing.

Other payables and accurals decreased by \$0.2 million from \$1.6 million in FY2024 to \$1.4 million in FY2025 with lower accruals of expenses.

Shareholders' equity for the Group and Company stood at \$55.5 million and \$47.3 million respectively as at FY2025, as compared with \$59.4 million and \$49.7 million respectively as at FY2024.

Cash flow of the Group

Although the Group has net cash outflows of \$2.1 million in FY2025, it continues to operate as a going concern generating positive operating cashflows. The Group has repaid \$0.4 million in bank loans. The Group will continue to adopt a cautious approach even as it seeks sustainable growth in its operations and in managing its operating costs effectively.

The Group operates within the food and beverage ("F&B") industry whereby the operating environment is expected to remain challenging in the near term due to a confluence of global and domestic factors.

Firstly, macroeconomic conditions continue to weigh on consumer sentiment. Persistent inflationary pressures, coupled with heightened global uncertainties and cautious discretionary spending, may dampen demand growth. Rising interest rates and foreign exchange volatility also affect operating costs, especially in relation to imported raw materials.

Secondly, the industry faces structural cost challenges, including higher raw material prices, increases in utilities, supply chain disruptions, and sustained upward pressure on manpower costs following regulatory adjustments to foreign worker policies and wage levels. These factors are expected to continue exerting margin pressure.

Thirdly, competition remains intense within the F&B sector. Consumer preferences are evolving rapidly, with increasing emphasis on health-conscious options, dining experiences, and convenience through delivery platforms. Established players and new entrants alike are investing heavily in marketing, product innovation, and digital engagement, which intensifies competitive conditions.

Looking ahead, the Group will maintain a cautious but proactive outlook. Over the next reporting period and the subsequent 12 months, the Group anticipates that external headwinds such as inflationary cost pressures, consumer caution, and competitive intensity will persist. Nonetheless, the Group remains committed to building resilience, sustaining long-term competitiveness, and positioning itself to capture recovery opportunities when economic conditions stabilise.
