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CLARIFICATION AND UPDATES ON OPERATIONS ARISING FROM THE MIDDLE EAST SITUATION

Singapore, March 9, 2026 – Sembcorp Industries (Sembcorp) refers to an earlier article published by the Global Water Intelligence, which was subsequently referenced in other media such as Associated Press, South China Morning Post, The Conversation and The Straits Times, relating to Iran’s strikes on desalination plants and its impact on the Gulf’s water supplies. In these articles, it was mentioned that there has been damage to the UAE’s Fujairah F1 power and water plant.

Sembcorp would like to clarify that there has been no damage at the Fujairah F1 Independent Water and Power Plant (IWPP), its 40%-owned asset located in the Emirate of Fujairah. Other than Fujairah F1 IWPP, Sembcorp also operates the Salalah IWPP and the Manah II Solar Independent Power Project, both located in Oman. Operations in all three facilities are currently continuing but as the events are evolving, Sembcorp continues to monitor the situation closely. All of Sembcorp’s employees are safe at the moment. The facilities have contingency measures in place, and the safety and wellbeing of Sembcorp’s employees remain its top priority as the company maintains operational stability.

In Singapore, Sembcorp’s gas supply remains secure, with no anticipated disruptions in the near term. The company is able to leverage its diversified portfolio of long-term natural gas supply contracts across both piped and liquefied sources. Sembcorp’s supply arrangements draw from multiple global origins and its upcoming liquefied natural gas cargo deliveries scheduled for 2026 are not from the Middle East region. In addition to natural gas, Sembcorp’s broader portfolio also includes renewable energy and energy storage solutions, which help diversify its overall energy mix.

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
