E. Notes to the condensed interim consolidated financial statements

1. Corporate information

Ley Choon Group Holdings Limited (the "**Company**") is incorporated and domiciled in Singapore and whose shares are publicly traded on the Catalist board of the Singapore Exchange. These condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the six months ended 30 September 2024 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the "**Group**").

The principal activity of the Company is that of an investment holding company. The principal activities of the subsidiaries are as below:

- Underground utilities infrastructure construction and maintenance services, which include water pipes, NEWater pipes, high-pressure gas pipes, high-voltage power cables, fiber optic cables and sewer pipeline rehabilitation;
- Road and airfield pavement construction and maintenance services, which include the supplying and laying of graded stones, cement treated base and milling and laying of asphalt premix; and
- Construction materials supply services, which include production of asphalt premix and recycled aggregates from construction and demolition waste.

2. Basis of Preparation

The condensed interim financial statements for the six months ended 30 September 2024 have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Accounting Standards Committee Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore dollar which is the Company's functional currency.

2.1. New and amended standards adopted by the Group

A number of amendments to standards have become applicable for the current reporting period. The Group did not have to change its accounting policies or make retrospective adjustments as a result of adopting those standards.

2.2. Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 March 2024.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

Information about estimates, assumptions and judgements in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements is as follows:

• Note 10 - Depreciation of property, plant and equipment and right-of-use assets

There were no significant changes in critical judgements, estimates and assumptions as compared to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 March 2024.

3. Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period.

4. Segment and revenue information

The Group is organised into the following main business segments:

Segment 1: Pipes & roads;

Segment 2: Construction materials; and Others

These operating segments are reported in a manner consistent with internal reporting provided to the Chief Executive Officer who is responsible for allocating resources and assessing performance of the operating segments.

5.1 Fair value measurement

The current results are in line with the commentary disclosed in paragraph 4 of the FY2024 Full Year results announcement dated 27 May 2024.

4. A commentary at the date of the announcement of the significant trends and competitive conditions of the industry in which the Group operates and any known factors or events that may affect the Group in the next operating period and the next 12 months

As per the press release by the Ministry of Trade and Industry ("MTI") on 14 October 2024⁽¹⁾, the construction sector grew by 3.1 per cent year-on-year in the third quarter. Growth during the quarter was on account of an increase in public sector construction output.

As per the announcement released by The Building and Construction Authority ("BCA") on 15 January 2024⁽²⁾, the business outlook for construction industry is expected to be strong, particularly in public sector and infrastructure construction segments. The public sector is expected to drive total construction demand in 2024, reaching between S\$18 billion and S\$21 billion.

The outlook for the construction industry remains positive and progressive, particularly in the public sector and infrastructure projects. However, global uncertainties, driven by geopolitical events and rising construction costs, are likely to impact the industry. Despite these challenges, the Group remains cautiously optimistic, maintaining a strong focus on the efficient execution of ongoing projects and enhancing operational efficiencies. Leveraging its solid track record and expertise, the Group will continue to pursue opportunities in underground infrastructure and utilities construction through careful and strategic tendering. Additionally, the Group remains vigilant in managing operating costs, cash flow, and potential business risks in the current environment.

To-date, the Group's unfulfilled order book stands at a healthy level of approximately S\$220.1 million.

8. Review of performance of the Group

Comprehensive income statement for the first half year ended 30 September 2024

Revenue

Revenue increased by approximately \$\$1.6 million or 2.5% to \$\$64.4 million for the first half year ended 30 September 2024 ("1HFY2025") compared to the revenue of the corresponding period ended 30 September 2023 ("1HFY2024") of \$\$62.8 million. The marginal increase in revenue is largely attributed to the higher construction activities in road works and cable laying projects. However, the increase in revenue was partially offset by the lower revenue from airport project as well as certain pipe laying projects which are nearing completion.

Gross profit

Gross profit was S\$13.3 million with a gross profit margin of 20.6% for 1HFY2025 compared to gross profit of S\$10.3 million with a gross profit margin of 16.3% for 1HFY2024. Gross profit rose due to higher revenue from the projects referred above combined with a favorable mix of relatively higher margin projects, both of which contributed to improved profitability for the period.

Other income

Other income for 1HFY2025 decreased by approximately \$\$0.2 million or 10.9% to \$\$1.5 million compared to \$\$1.7 million in 1HFY2024 mainly due to absence of gains from foreign exchange. However, the decrease was partially offset by higher income from the training center and sales of scrap materials during the period.

Selling and distribution expenses

Selling and distribution expenses for 1HFY2025 increased by 26.7% to S\$0.1 million compared to 1HFY2024 due mainly to certain business related expenses incurred during the period.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses for 1HFY2025 increased approximately by S\$0.6 million or 11.9% compared to 1HFY2024 due mainly to increase in staff remuneration related expenses and certain office expenses during the period.

Impairment losses on trade receivables

The impairment losses on trade receivables for 1HFY2025 was due mainly to the provision of bad debts related to a customer who is under voluntary liquidation under the pipes and roads business segment.

Other operating expenses

Other operating expenses for 1HFY2025 increased by approximately S\$0.1 million or 184.2% to S\$0.1 million compared to 1HFY2024 mainly due to the increase in foreign exchange losses during the period.

Finance costs

Finance costs for 1HFY2025 decreased by approximately S\$0.5 million or 74.2% to S\$0.2 million compared to 1HFY2024 of S\$0.7 million, primarily due to the full repayment of the borrowings.

Net profit

The Group reported a net profit after tax of S\$7.3 million for 1HFY2025 compared to 1HFY2024 of S\$5.4 million due to the various reasons as explained above.

Consolidated statements of financial position

Non-current assets

The Group's non-current assets decreased by S\$2.0 million from S\$23.4 million as at 31 March 2024 to S\$21.4 million as at 30 September 2024, attributable mainly to:

- (a) decrease in property, plant and equipment by S\$1.8 million to S\$13.3 million as at 30 September 2024 compared to S\$15.1 million as at 31 March 2024 due mainly to the depreciation of S\$2.8 million, disposal of plant and equipment of S\$0.1 million; partially offset by additional of plant and equipment amounting to S\$0.4 million and reclassification of fully paid right-of-use assets of S\$0.6 million; and
- (b) decrease in right-of-use assets by S\$0.2 million to S\$7.7 million as at 30 September 2024 compared to S\$7.9 million as at 31 March 2024, due mainly to the depreciation of S\$1.0 million and the reclassification of S\$0.6 million to property, plant and equipment; partially offset by additions of plant and machinery amounting to S\$1.4 million.

Current assets

The Group's current assets stood at S\$66.0 million as at 30 September 2024 and 31 March 2024. However, there are some movements in the individual items, as below:

- (a) increase in contract assets by \$\$10.8 million to \$\$39.3 million as at 30 September 2024 compared to \$\$28.5 million as at 31 March 2024 due mainly to the decrease in billing from the projects;
- (b) increase in fixed deposit of S\$1.0 million during the period; and
- (c) increase in inventories by S\$0.7 million to S\$7.1 million as at 30 September 2024 compared to S\$6.4 million as at 31 March 2024 due mainly to purchase of materials for ongoing projects;

Which were partially offset by:

- (d) decrease in trade and other receivables by \$\$6.4 million to \$\$10.9 million as at 30 September 2024 compared to \$\$17.3 million as at 31 March 2024 due mainly to the increase in collections from customers during the period;
- (e) decrease in cash and cash equivalents by \$\$5.9 million to \$\$3.5 million as at 30 September 2024 compared to \$\$9.4 million as at 31 March 2024 due mainly to the payment of trade and other payables and dividends payment to the shareholders during the period; and
- (f) decrease in prepayment by S\$0.4 million due mainly to the receipts of materials from the suppliers to whom advance payments were made.

Current liabilities

The Group's current liabilities decreased by S\$5.5 million from S\$26.3 million as at 31 March 2024 to S\$20.8 million as at 30 September 2024 due mainly to:

- (a) decrease in trade and other payable by S\$5.6 million to S\$17.7 million as at 30 September 2024 compared to S\$23.3 million as at 31 March 2024 due mainly to increase in payments made to the creditors; and
- (b) decrease in lease liabilities by S\$0.3 million due mainly to repayment of lease;

which were partially offset by an increase in current income tax liabilities by S\$0.6 million due to provision of corporate tax.

Non-current liabilities

The Group's non-current liabilities increased by S\$0.2 million from S\$3.3 million as at 31 March 2024 to S\$3.4 million as at 30 September 2024 due mainly to higher deferred tax liabilities and additional lease liabilities.

Consolidated statement of cash flow

The Group's cash and cash equivalents stood at S\$3.5 million as at 30 September 2024, as compared to S\$9.4 million as at 31 March 2024.

Net cash generated from operating activities

Net cash generated from operating activities was S\$1.2 million, comprising operating cash flows before working capital changes of S\$11.9 million, net working capital outflow of S\$10.5 million and income tax payment of S\$0.1 million.

The net working capital outflow of S\$10.5 million was due mainly to the following:

- (a) increase in inventories of approximately S\$0.7 million due to purchase of of materials for the ongoing projects; and
- (b) increase in contract assets of approximately S\$10.8 million due mainly to the decrease in billing from the projects;
- (c) decrease in trade and other receivables of approximately S\$6.2 due mainly to increase in collections from customers during the period;
- (d) decrease in prepayment of approximately S\$0.4 million due to the receipts of materials from the suppliers to whom advance payments were made; and
- (e) decrease in trade and other payables of approximately S\$5.6 million due to increase in payments made to the creditors.

Net cash used in investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities of approximately S\$0.3 million was due mainly to the purchase of plant and equipment and right-of-use assets which was partially offset by proceeds from disposal of plant and equipment.

Net cash used in financing activities

Net cash used in financing activities of approximately S\$6.8 million was due mainly to dividend payment, repayment of lease liabilities and interest payments.
