#### E. Notes to the condensed interim consolidated financial statements

#### 1. Corporate information

Ley Choon Group Holdings Limited (the "**Company**") is incorporated and domiciled in Singapore and whose shares are publicly traded on the Catalist board of the Singapore Exchange. These condensed interim consolidated financial statements as at and for the six months ended 30 September 2025 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the "**Group**").

The principal activity of the Company is that of an investment holding company. The principal activities of the subsidiaries are as below:

- Underground utilities infrastructure construction and maintenance services, which include water pipes, NEWater pipes, high-pressure gas pipes, high-voltage power cables, fiber optic cables and sewer pipeline rehabilitation;
- Road and airfield pavement construction and maintenance services, which include the supplying and laying of graded stones, cement treated base and milling and laying of asphalt premix; and
- Construction materials supply services, which include production of asphalt premix and recycled aggregates from construction and demolition waste.

#### 2. Basis of Preparation

The condensed interim financial statements for the six months ended 30 September 2025 have been prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) 1-34 *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Accounting Standards Committee Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore dollar which is the Company's functional currency.

#### 2.1. New and amended standards adopted by the Group

A number of amendments to standards have become applicable for the current reporting period. The Group did not have to change its accounting policies or make retrospective adjustments as a result of adopting those standards.

#### 2.2. Use of judgements and estimates

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 March 2025.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

Information about estimates, assumptions and judgements in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements is as follows:

• Note 10 - Depreciation of property, plant and equipment and right-of-use assets

There were no significant changes in critical judgements, estimates and assumptions as compared to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 March 2025.

#### 3. Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period.

#### 4. Segment and revenue information

The Group is organised into the following main business segments:

Segment 1: Pipes & roads;

Segment 2: Construction materials; and Others

These operating segments are reported in a manner consistent with internal reporting provided to the Chief Executive Officer who is responsible for allocating resources and assessing performance of the operating segments.

4. A commentary at the date of the announcement of the significant trends and competitive conditions of the industry in which the Group operates and any known factors or events that may affect the Group in the next operating period and the next 12 months

The outlook for the construction industry remains positive, supported by sustained public sector demand and continued infrastructure development in Singapore. While global uncertainties and rising construction costs may persist, overall activity in the sector is expected to remain resilient.

The Group remains confident in navigating the evolving business environment and continues to focus on sustainable growth through disciplined and strategic tendering in underground infrastructure and utilities projects. Ongoing efforts to enhance operational efficiency, strengthen cost management, and optimise cash flow will further reinforce the Group's resilience and competitiveness.

Separately, the Group is also reviewing its lease arrangements for certain operating facilities in Singapore. While some adjustments may be required in the medium term, no significant disruption to operations is anticipated. The Group is proactively preparing to ensure operational continuity and readiness for future growth over the next 12 months.

To-date, the Group's unfulfilled order book stands at a healthy level of approximately S\$350.3 million.

The Group has not obtained a general mandate from shareholders for interested party transactions. The Group had no interested party transactions during the period.

#### 8. Review of performance of the Group

#### Comprehensive income statement for the first half year ended 30 September 2025

The Group is primarily organised into two business segments: Pipes & Roads and Construction Materials. The Pipes & Roads segment accounted for approximately 98.8% of the Group's total revenue, while the Construction Materials segment contributed the remaining 1.2%. This distribution remains largely consistent with the previous year.

#### <u>Revenue</u>

Revenue for the first half year ended 30 September 2025 ("**1HFY2026**") remained relatively stable at approximately S\$64.4 million, consistent with the amount recorded in the corresponding period of the previous financial year ("**1HFY2025**"). The stable performance was mainly supported by ongoing pipe-laying and cable-laying projects, which partially offset lower contributions from road works projects. Revenue from this segment was lower as a major section under an existing contract has been completed, while newly awarded projects are still in the initial stages of commencement and are expected to ramp up progressively over the coming periods.

#### Gross profit

Gross profit was S\$11.4 million with a gross profit margin of 17.8% for 1HFY2026, compared to a gross profit of S\$13.3 million with a gross profit margin of 20.6% for 1HFY2025. The overall gross profit and gross margin were lower year-on-year. This was mainly due to the lower revenue from the completed projects, current composition of projects, with some new contracts still in their early stages and others at different phases of completion, resulting in margin variation arising from the project mix.

#### Other income

Other income for 1HFY2026 decreased by approximately S\$0.3 million, or 17.8%, to S\$1.2 million, compared to S\$1.5 million in 1HFY2025, due mainly to a decrease in income from scrap sales.

#### Selling and distribution expenses

Selling and distribution expenses for 1HFY2026 increased by 15.8% to S\$0.1 million compared to 1HFY2025, due mainly to higher business travelling expenses incurred during the period.

#### Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses for 1HFY2026 increased by approximately S\$0.4 million compared to 1HFY2025, due mainly to higher administrative staff-related costs as well as increase in certain office expenses incurred during the period.

#### Impairment losses on trade receivables reversed

The reversal of impairment losses on trade receivables for 1HFY2026 was due mainly to the recovery of overdue collections.

#### Other operating expenses

Other operating expenses for 1HFY2026 decreased by approximately S\$0.04 million, or 39.8%, compared to 1HFY2025, due mainly to a decrease in foreign exchange losses during the period.

#### Finance costs

Finance costs for 1HFY2026 increased by approximately S\$0.02 million, or 11.1%, to S\$0.2 million compared to 1HFY2025, due mainly to an increase in interest expense on lease liabilities.

#### Net profit

The Group reported a net profit after tax of S\$6.1 million for 1HFY2026 compared to 1HFY2025 of S\$7.3 million due to the various reasons as explained above.

#### Consolidated statements of financial position

#### Non-current assets

The Group's non-current assets increased by \$\$3.0 million from \$\$21.0 million as at 31 March 2025 to \$\$24.0 million as at 30 September 2025, attributable mainly to:

(a) increase in right-of-use assets by S\$4.3 million to S\$11.5 million as at 30 September 2025 compared to S\$7.2 million as at 31 March 2025, mainly attributable to additions of right-of-use assets amounting to S\$5.6 million, partially offset by the depreciation of S\$1.2 million and reclassification of S\$\$0.1 million to property, plant and equipment;

- (b) increase in other receivables by S\$0.6 million mainly due to the reclassification of loan receivable from current assets to non-current assets in line with the repayment schedule;
  - which were partially offset by:
- (c) decrease in property, plant and equipment by S\$1.9 million to S\$10.9 million as at 30 September 2025 compared to S\$12.8 million as at 31 March 2025 due mainly to the depreciation of S\$2.5 million, disposal of plant and equipment of S\$0.1 million; partially offset by additions of plant and equipment amounting to S\$0.6 million and reclassification of fully paid right-of-use assets of S\$0.1 million.

#### Current assets

The Group's current assets decreased by S\$0.8 million from S\$76.6 million as at 31 March 2025 to S\$75.8 million as at 30 September 2025, attributable mainly to:

- (a) decrease in trade and other receivables by S\$7.9 million to S\$14.6 million as at 30 September 2025 compared to S\$22.5 million as at 31 March 2025 due mainly to increase in collections from customers and reclassification of loan receivable from current assets to non-current assets as mentioned above;
- (b) decrease in cash and bank deposits by S\$3.4 million to S\$11.7 million as at 30 September 2025 compared to S\$15.1 million as at 31 March 2025 due mainly to the dividend payment to the shareholders and payment of trade and other payables during the period;

which were partially offset by:

- (c) increase in contract assets by S\$7.5 million to S\$35.5 million as at 30 September 2025 compared to S\$28.0 million as at 31 March 2025 due mainly to the decrease in billing during the period;
- (d) increase in prepayments by S\$2 million due mainly to premiums paid for performance bond and insurance mainly in relation to the new projects and the advance payment made to the suppliers for material purchase for certain projects; and
- (e) increase in inventories by S\$1.0 million to S\$7.5 million as at 30 September 2025 compared to S\$6.5 million as at 31 March 2025 due mainly to the purchase of materials for ongoing projects.

#### **Current liabilities**

The Group's current liabilities decreased by S\$1.0 million from S\$23.7 million as at 31 March 2025 to S\$22.7 million as at 30 September 2025 due mainly to:

- (a) decrease in borrowings by S\$1.2 million due mainly to the repayment of borrowings;
- (b) decrease in trade and other payables by \$\$1.0 million to \$\$17.9 million as at 30 September 2025, compared to \$\$18.9 million as at 31 March 2025 due mainly to an increase in payments made to suppliers and subcontractors;
- (c) decrease in current income tax liabilities by S\$0.6 million due mainly to income tax payments made during the period;
  - which were partially offset by
- (d) increase in lease liabilities by S\$1.8 million due mainly to the additions to the right-of-use assets.

#### Non-current liabilities

The Group's non-current liabilities increased by S\$1.5 million from S\$3.2 million as at 31 March 2025 to S\$4.7 million as at 30 September 2025 due mainly to additional lease liabilities.

#### Consolidated statement of cash flow

The Group's cash and cash equivalents stood at approximately S\$11.7 million as at 30 September 2025, as compared to S\$15.1 million as at 31 March 2025.

#### Net cash generated from operating activities

Net cash generated from operating activities was S\$5.0 million, comprising operating cash flows before working capital changes of S\$9.6 million, net working capital outflow of S\$4.2 million and income taxes paid of S\$0.4 million.

The net working capital outflow of S\$4.2 million was due mainly to the following:

- (a) increase in contract assets of approximately S\$7.5 million due mainly to the decrease in billing during the period;
- (b) decrease in trade and other receivables of approximately S\$7.3 million due mainly to increase in collections from customers during the period;
- (c) decrease in trade and other payables of approximately S\$1.0 million due mainly to an increase in payments made to suppliers and subcontractors;
- (d) increase in prepayments by S\$2 million due mainly to premiums paid for performance bond and insurance in relation to the new projects and the advance payment made to the suppliers for material purchase for certain projects; and
- (e) increase in inventories of approximately S\$1.0 million due mainly to the purchase of materials for ongoing projects.

#### Net cash used in investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities of approximately S\$0.8 million was due mainly to the purchase of property, plant and equipment and right-of-use assets, partially offset by proceeds from the disposal of property, plant and equipment and interest received.

#### Net cash used in financing activities

Net cash used in financing activities of approximately S\$7.7 million was due mainly to dividend payment, repayment of bill payables, lease liabilities and interest payments.
