1 Corporate Information

Y Ventures Group Ltd (the "Company") (Co. Reg. No. 201300274R) was incorporated and domiciled in Singapore. It is listed on the Catalist Board of Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited.

The registered office of the Company is at 7 Temasek Boulevard, #12-04 Suntec Tower One, Singapore 038987.

These condensed interim financial statements as at and for the half-year ended 30 June 2025 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (together referred to as the "**Group**").

The principal activity of the Company is that of an investment holding company. The principal activities of the Group are:

- a) E-commerce retail and distribution
- b) Logistics and freight forwarding services; and
- c) Waste management services

2 Basis of preparation

The condensed interim financial statements for half-year ended 30 June 2025 have been prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) ("SFRS(I)") 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group since the last audited annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I) except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in United States Dollar ("US\$") which is the Company's functional currency.

2.1 New and revised standards adopted by the Group

On 1 January 2025, the Group has adopted the new and revised SFRS(I) and SFRS(I) Interpretation ("SFRS(I) INT") that are relevant to its operations and effective for the current financial period. Changes to the Group's accounting policies have been made as required, in accordance with the transactional provisions in the respective SFRS(I) and SFRS(I) INT.

The adoption of these new and revised SFRS(I) and SFRS(I) INT did not have any material effect of the financial results or position of the Group and the Company.

2.2 Use of estimates and judgements

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects.

Information about assumptions and estimation uncertainties that have a significant risk of resulting in a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial period are include in the following notes:

Inventories are written down below cost to net realisable value if they are slow-moving or if their selling prices have declined. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated selling expenses. Management identifies inventories where the net realisable value is lower than cost on a title-by-title basis by considering market transacted price close to period end, publisher of the book title and current market condition. Write-down of inventories to their net realisable values charged to the Group's profit or loss for the current financial period was US\$ Nil during the financial period (31 December 2024: US\$44,000).

2 Review of the Performance of the Group

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE (CONDENSED INTERIM STATEMENT OF PROFIT OR LOSS AND OTHER COMPREHENSIVE INCOME)

1H 2025

Revenue

The revenue decreased by 40.9% or US\$5.47 million from US\$13.37 million in 1H 2024 to US\$7.90 million in 1H 2025 mainly due to a decrease in the sales of books through online marketplaces which were impacted by competitive market conditions during the financial period.

Cost of sales

The cost of sales decreased by 46.4% or US\$3.67 million from US\$7.93 million in 1H 2024 to US\$4.26 million in 1H 2025 mainly due to the corresponding decrease in sales during the financial period.

Gross profit and gross profit margin

The Group's gross profit decreased by 32.9% or US\$1.79 million from US\$5.43 million in 1H 2024 to US\$3.64 million in 1H 2025. Despite the decrease in gross profit, the gross profit margin improved from 40.7% in 1H 2024 to 46.1% in 1H 2025 due to a lower cost of sales in 1H 2025.

Other Income

The other income decreased by 93.1% or US\$96,020 from US\$103,183 in 1H 2024 to US\$7,163 in 1H 2025 due to the recognition of a one-off government grant and service income in 1H 2024 with no similar income recorded in 1H 2025.

Selling and distribution expenses

The selling and distribution expenses decreased by 38.0% or US\$1.58 million from US\$4.16 million in 1H 2024 to US\$2.58 million in 1H 2025 mainly due to the corresponding decrease in sales.

Administrative expenses

The administrative expenses decreased by 6.7% or US\$0.09 million from US\$1.44 million in 1H 2024 to US\$1.35 million in 1H 2025 mainly due to strict cost control during the period.

Finance cost

The finance costs increased by US\$3,540 from US\$1,366 in 1H 2024 to US\$4,906 in 1H 2025 due to higher interest expenses on lease liabilities arising from new leases entered into towards the end of 2024.

Loss for the period

The loss before tax increased by US\$0.21 million from US\$0.05 million in 1H 2024 to US\$0.26 million in 1H 2025, mainly due to the decrease in gross profit of US\$1.79 million and other income of US\$0.10 million, offset by the decrease in administrative expenses of US\$0.10 million and selling and distribution expenses of US\$1.58 million.

Current assets

The current assets decreased by 7.4% or US\$1.69 million from US\$22.97 million as at 31 December 2024 to US\$21.28 million as at 30 June 2025. This was mainly due to the decrease in cash and bank balances and inventories, offset against the increase in trade and other receivables.

Non-current assets

Non-current assets decreased by 26.7% or US\$0.04 million from US\$0.15 million as at 31 December 2024 to US\$0.11 million as at 30 June 2025. This was primarily due to the periodic depreciation/amortisation of right-of-use assets.

Current liabilities

The current liabilities decreased by 6.6% or US\$1.40 million from US\$21.13 million as at 31 December 2024 and US\$19.73 million as at 30 June 2025. This was mainly due to the decrease in trade and other payables following settlements made during the period.

Non-current liabilities

Non-current liabilities decreased by 63.6% or US\$0.07 million from US\$0.11 million as at 31 December 2024 and US\$0.04 million as at 30 June 2025 mainly due to the repayment of the borrowings during the period.

Working capital

The Group's working capital decreased by 15.8% or US\$0.29 million from US\$1.84 million as at 31 December 2024 to US\$1.55 million as at 30 June 2025.

Shareholders' equity

The Group's shareholders' equity attributable to equity holders decreased by 13.8% or US\$0.26 million from US\$1.88 million as at 31 December 2024 to US\$1.62 million as at 30 June 2025 mainly due to the loss incurred in 1H 2025.

Net cash used in operating activities for 1H 2025 amounted to US\$0.76 million, primarily driven by net losses incurred during the period and working capital outflow of US\$0.54 million.

The working capital outflow was mainly due to an increase in trade and other receivables of US\$0.49 million and decrease in trade and other payables of US\$1.43 million, offset against a reduction in inventory purchases of US\$1.40 million.

Net cash used in financing activities of US\$0.04 million was mainly due to repayment of borrowings.

Overall, the cash and cash equivalents of the Group decreased in 1H 2025, ending the period with cash and cash equivalents of US\$0.89 million.

The Group experienced a challenging period in 1H 2025, with sales declining by 40.9% compared to the same period last year due to competitive market conditions in its primary market. The Group will continue to respond to these challenges appropriately to mitigate its impact.

Given this environment, financial prudence remains a key priority. Despite the drop in revenue, the Group improved its gross profit margin from 40.7% to 46.1% driven by disciplined pricing strategies during the uncertain period as well as reducing its operating expenses by 6.7% through strict cost control.

Looking ahead, the Group continues to remain focused on executing its long term strategies while pursuing new opportunities, as they arise, to support long-term, sustainable growth.
