Review of Results for Half Year Ended 31 December 2020 (1H21)

Group revenue for the first six months ended 31 December 2020 (1H21) fell 39% from \$62.7 million to \$38.0 million. Loss after tax amounted \$3.7 million.

Sales were adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Sales in Singapore fell 30%; in Malaysia by 41% as the country experienced a second wave of infections and implemented a series of partial lockdowns from 5 May 2020 to mid February 2021.

In Malaysia, the Recovery Movement Control Order introduced from mid June and lasted 125 days but interstate and interdistrict travels were permitted and the public could travel to work. This helped sales for the period.

However, following a spike in daily COVID-19 cases, a Conditional Movement Control Order came into force from 14 October to 6 December 2020 in 9 out of 13 states and all three federal territories – Kuala Lumpur, Putrajaya and Labuan. During this period, malls remained open but footfall especially in the Klang Valley where most of our stores are located, was down significantly due to the movement restrictions. To offset the falling sales in our brick-and-mortar stores, the team directed their efforts to home deliveries through catalogue sales and personal selling as well as encouraging customers to shop online at our online stores.

Turnover for our Indonesia associate company declined 42% compared to 1H20. A partial lockdown was implemented from 15 June to 13 September 2020. Schools were closed, dining in restaurants was prohibited and malls were allowed to operate at only 50% capacity. A further spike in cases forced another partial lockdown which continued into January 2021. The Group's share of loss in Indonesia was \$1.8 million from \$868,000 in 1H20 although the associate managed to reduce the loss in the second quarter compared to 1Q21.

As part of the Group's plan to diversify its revenue base, we expanded into the health and wellness sector with the launch of skincare products and air purifiers. We initially launched Dr Barbara Sturm, a high end brand of molecular cosmetics, online in October 2020. This was followed two months later by a pop-up store at Ngee Ann City, Singapore. On 13 August 2020, we signed an exclusive distributionship agreement with AIRFREE Products Electronics SA from Portugal for the distribution of "AIRFREE" proprietary air purifiers in Singapore and Malaysia.

Our e-commerce business now includes nine brands and is seeing encouraging results since we ramped up our presence in cyberspace just before the COVID-19 lockdown last year. During the first six months of our current financial year, turnover from online channels accounted for 5% of total sales in Singapore and 2% in Malaysia. We started the online business in Malaysia later and are currently pursuing other brands for our online platform.

Gross profit margin declined marginally from 50% to 49% during the period under review despite us having to offer various promotions and discounts to drive traffic to stores.

Group operating expenses fell 27% to \$21.7 million mainly due to rental rebates, salary reduction and lower other operating expenses.

Other income comprises mainly wage credits and job support scheme grants from the Government.

(ii) Balance Sheet

Inventory decreased by 13% to \$25.2 million following the cancellation of incoming shipments.

Net borrowings totalled \$10.8 million, down from \$13.0 million as at 30 June 2020 and gearing was at 31% compared to 34% as at 30 June 2020.

(iii) Cash Flows

As at 31 December 2020, the Group generated net cash flows of \$9.5 million from operating activities and repaid bank borrowings and interest expense of \$4.0 million.

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic is expected to continue to weigh down on markets like Malaysia and Indonesia which are still struggling to tackle second and third waves of coronavirus infections. The progressive rollout of a vaccine programme in markets where we operate in augurs well for a sustained economic recovery although cross-border restrictions and social distancing measures will delay any significant upturn in regional tourism and spending. We will continue to monitor this global public health crisis and will step up efforts to strengthen our e-commerce capabilities with further investments in digital marketing and customer service technology.

The Company has on 22 October 2020 announced its intention to undertake a proposed transfer of listing of the Company from the Main Board of the SGX-ST to the Catalist Board of the SGX-ST (the "Proposed Transfer"). The Proposed Transfer is subject to, *inter alia*, the inprinciple approval of the SGX-ST for the Proposed Transfer, and the approval of the shareholders of the Company by way of special resolution at an extraordinary general meeting ("EGM") of the Company to be convened. The Company has applied to the SGX-ST for an extension of a further three months to exit the Financial Watch List pending the Proposed Transfer. This extension is to allow the Company more time to complete the Proposed Transfer. On 13 November 2020, the Company received approval from SGX-ST for the extension to 4 March 2021.

The Company has on 24 January 2021 announced that it received in-principle approval from SGX-ST on the Proposed Transfer subject to certain conditions. An extraordinary general meeting will be held on 24 February 2021 to seek shareholders' approval on the Proposed Transfer.
